Rev's Revelations

I've been thinking about the call process a lot lately—because our fabulous Intern Pastor Joy and our awesome Intern Pastor Kelsey are both entering that process soon. Our beloved church member and seminarian Andrea will be moving on to internship in Loveland in August. And, our call with Deaconess Ann, who has served as our fantastic Faith Formation Interim Director, will come to a close when we hire a long-term director. She, too, will be eligible for a new call. We, at Bethlehem, are blessed to be part of so many call processes and we pray for all good things for these strong women in faith and their future congregations!

In the ELCA, the call process can be likened to a dating app. A minister (who might be a pastor or a deacon) fills out a form called the Rostered Minister Profile. A congregation fills out a form called the Ministry Site Profile. Then a combination of highly trained bishops and synod staff members, who have interviewed both the minister and congregation, begin comparing profiles and making matches. And, while the process seems long for congregations waiting for that minister, I can assure you it's *at least* as long for the minister. There are a series of interviews between candidates and congregations. Eventually, the right congregation and the right minister click.

I have also been remembering my own call process with you all at Bethlehem. Two years ago, we started the interview process. Only a few months after we "made it official," our relationship as pastor and congregation the pandemic threw us into one of the hardest relationships to maintain—a long distance one. While we could visit each other periodically, video chat, text, and phone one another, we couldn't do the normal things a pastor and congregation does. We missed out on so many morning coffees, dinners and potlucks, decorating for holidays, and even those awkward "Oh you got your haircut" conversations that people are never sure if they should have with their spouses or pastors. (Note: You should only have those conversations if you're complimenting the haircut. You're welcome spouses.)

To the point: our life together in the church is constantly changing. These coming weeks and months will be important for our congregation. We will be sending off Seminarian Andrea, Intern Joy and Deaconess Ann, meeting a new Faith Formation Director, and you and I will be learning how to be pastor and congregation both in-person and online in this bizarre moment in time. July 4: Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

Jesus does great deeds of power and gives his disciples authority over demons. Yet none of this power is unilateral; it all must be received by faith. Jesus asks his disciples to go out without money or supplies, so that they will be dependent on how others receive them. When we are sent from the assembly to witness and to heal, we are asked to be vulnerable, to be dependent on the reception of others. The Spirit always operates in the "between": between Jesus and his Abba, between Jesus and us, between you and me, between us and those to whom we are sent. Edited from Sundays and Seasons

July 13: Seventh Sunday after Pentecost

When Amos reports his vision of God judging Israel for its mistreatment of the poor, he becomes a threat to the power of the priests and the king. John the Baptist also speaks truth to power, and Herod has him killed. In Herod's fear that Jesus is John returned from the dead, we may hear hope for the oppressed: all the prophets killed through the ages are alive in Jesus. July 20: Eighth Sunday after Pentecost


Mark's gospel makes clear how great is the press of the crowd, with its countless needs to be met, on Jesus and his disciples. Yet in today's gospel Jesus advises his disciples to get away and rest, to take care of themselves. Sometimes we think that when others are in great need we shouldn't think of ourselves at all; but Jesus also honors the caregivers' need. We are sent from Christ's table to care for others and for ourselves. Edited from Sundays and Seasons

Today is the first of five Sundays with gospel readings from John 6, the first four of which focus on Jesus as bread of life. Today Jesus feeds thousands of people with five loaves and two fish. What we have, what we bring to Jesus' table, seems like it is not nearly enough to meet all the needs we see around us. But it is not the adequacy of our supplies or our skills that finally makes the difference: it is the power of Jesus working in the littlest and least to transform this world into the world God desires, a world where all the hungry are satisfied. Covid-19 and Pandemic Updates

We will hold an indoor and an outdoor service each Sunday. For the first week of this model we will hold indoor worship at 8:00 a.m. and outdoor worship at 10:15 a.m. Worship leaders will monitor attendance and needs to determine which service will be outdoors. (Note: seating for outdoor worship will be under the pavilion and stable.) We will hold an outdoor coffee hour between services in the stable.

There is no sign-up for these services, however, there are some basic guidelines we ask members and guests to follow.

We know that a number of our members, including children, people who are immunocompromised and others, remain more vulnerable, and we seek to create a space for us all. Masks are to be worn when entering the church building, in common areas (such as hallways, restrooms, etc.), and during indoor worship. We continue to wear masks in these spaces per Boulder County recommendations and expect to drop mask requirements after Boulder County reaches an 80% vaccination rate for the total population.

Foster Parents Needed


