Rev's Revelations

Through **God**'s abundant love we invite, welcome, and serve as a light in the world.

On Epiphany Sunday, we received Star Words. In years past the words have come from various bible verses or Christian themes and even other languages. This year, our Star Words come from the mission statement written by our Strategic Planning Team in 2020/21. While you ponder your word (and while I ponder mine), we will ponder together a new word each month. During March, we ponder God.

God is known by many names: Father, Son, Spirit, El, Elohim, Yahweh/Lord, Word, the great *I AM*.

God is seen as and in many things: a burning bush, the vine, the wind, a lion, an eagle, a mother hen.

God is embodied in many ways: a breath, a voice, the hand and arm.

God is exemplified in people: a child, the master, the servant, the vine keeper, the shepherd, the teacher, the potter, the priest, the planter, the metalworker, the parent, the maker, the friend.

This list is not comprehensive—God is understood as more than each of these! People in every time and place have experienced God, wondered about God, and identified God in different ways. People have devoted their lives to theology—the study (ology) of God (theo). Some people observe a God who is the same always—who is all powerful, all knowing, always present. Some people observe a God who seems to change—who appears to people in new (and old) ways.

Personally, I experience God (and God's abundant love) as timeless. This is why I so often use the liturgical greeting, "Grace and peace to you from God who is, who was, and who is to come." I witness God as the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and end. God is

the God of the past, present and future. God is always loving toward creation and always giving that love in new ways. During the season of Lent (which begins with Ash Wednesday on March 2) our church communities of Bethlehem and Light of Christ will meditate on the Timeless God.

As you ponder your own Star Word this month, also ponder God. How do you experience God? Which images of God (Lord, Spirit, breath, teacher, etc) are helpful and meaningful to you? Which images of God might be helpful or meaningful to others?

March 6 - Lent 1

These forty days called Lent are like no other. It is our opportune time to return to the God who rescues, to receive the gifts of God's grace, to believe with the heart and confess with the mouth the wonder of God's love in Jesus, and to resist temptation at every turn. This is no small pilgrimage on which we have just embarked. It is a struggle Jesus knew. It is a struggle Jesus shares. The nearness of the Lord, in bread and wine, water and word, will uphold and sustain us. **Readings**: Deuteronomy 26:1–11, Luke 4:1–13

March 13 - Lent 2

Though we sometimes doubt and often resist God's desire to protect and save us, our God persists. In holy baptism, God's people have been called and gathered into a God — initiated relationship that will endure. Lent provides the church with a time and a tradition in which to seek God's face again. Lent provides another occasion to behold the God of our salvation in the face of the Blessed One who "comes in the name of the Lord."

Readings: Genesis 15:1–12, 17–28, Luke 13:31–35

March 20 - Lent 3

The warnings are plentiful and blunt on the third Sunday in Lent. Cut it out or get cut down! The warnings are accompanied by God's invitation to attentiveness: "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The landowner's ultimatum is forestalled by the gardener's readiness to till the ground one more year. That is good news for all of us. Thanks be to God!

Readings: Isaiah 55;1–9, Luke 13:1–9

March 27 - Lent 4

The psalm sets the tone this day: "Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sin is put away!" Happy are those who have "become the righteousness of God" in the merits of Christ Jesus. Happy are those for whom the forgiveness of God has "rolled away . . . the disgrace" of former times. Happy is the father at the return of his prodigal son. Happy are we that

our sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. Rejoice! **Readings**: Psalm 32, Luke 15:1–3, 11b–32

April 3 - Lent 5

Our God makes all things new. In the first reading God promises it. In the gospel Mary anticipates it, anointing Jesus' feet with costly perfume in preparation for the day of his burial. In baptism, God's new person (you!) rises daily from the deadly mire of trespasses and sins.

Readings: Isaiah 43:16-21, John 12:1-8

Lenten Midweek Worship - Timeless God

On Ash Wednesday we recall that phrase ashes to ashes, we remember our own beginning and end, and we realize our humanity. This year we will also reflect on God's presence as the Alpha and Omega and meditate on God who is with us and all of creation from beginning to end. While we embrace the penitent nature of Lent we also celebrate the Timeless God, holding onto the promise proclaimed in 2 Corinthians: "See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation!"

Council Meeting



Summary of Council Meeting Minutes February 8, 2022:

The Council met on February 8, 2022, with Pr. Katie Chullino, Alex Hoime, Mark Holste, Jenny Kelley, Todd Propp, Greg Schumann, Cindy Tayler, and Jamie Updegraff in attendance; Matt James, Steve Dawson, and Jim Woodruff were absent.

Treasurer Greg Schumann called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. Following a devotion from Pr. Katie on the 'Star' word "abundance" and a reading from Ladder to the Light by Steven Charleston, it was noted that minutes from the last council meeting were approved by email and made available in the library. In addition, we approved a motion by Greg Schumann to authorize paying Gary Knutson's January medical premium and increased retirement contribution with the contribution not to exceed \$1000.00. Matt James seconded the motion, and the motion carried by an email vote.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Greg reports that we were only about \$500 below budget for General Fund giving for January! Expenses were about \$4000 below budget; some of this was due to the salary increases for 2022 not showing up until February since our Annual Meeting is at the end of January. This Annual Meeting was one of the best in a number of years as far as preparation, participation, feedback, and response. The Finance team will address those paying their full pledge amount in a lump sum so it does not skew the budget numbers. There are no major expenses now. In reviewing the financial reports, note that January 2021 had an extra \$30,000 designated gift for the playground as income so not counting that \$30,000, January 2022 income is actually close to last January's income. Jenny Kelley moved to approve the

financial report as presented: Mark Holste seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

MINISTRY REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

Pastor: Pr. Katie referred to her report. She noted that singing was less in January due to increased Covid19 exposure risk, as requested by our singers; there is a full slate of Word for Kids back in rotation; the Annual Meeting went well and we have a good solid budget that reflected feedback from congregation members. Disaster response: Pr. Katie is looking for support to form a BLC Disaster Response team—please contact her if interested. Lent is coming in early March! Pr. Katie and Greg will double check the insurance for the van on loan to Christ the Servant.

Evangelism: Cindy Tayler will meet later this week with Boband is looking forward to meeting with new members, neighborhood groups, and small groups.

Faith Formation: Jamie Updegraff has a report template for next month; the overall main focus for Faith Formation is still contacting families. Thanks to Marissa Carlson and Sue Smith for the Sunday School program! We have four regularly attending confirmation classes; the HS National Youth Gathering was just canceled last week. The elementary age ministry events continuing are dependent on the pandemic. Jamie gives a big shout out to Gary for communicating in person with families and kids and being willing to go the extra mile to show up on door steps.

Property: Alex Hoime is jumping into the position and will talk to Matt to get up to speed on what's needed.

Missions: Mark Holste noted highlights from his report—Manna continues meals for HOPE, Habitat builds continue, and he will present more requests under New Business.

Stewardship: Todd Propp discussed a program called Consecration Sunday whose premise is not what does the church need but what percentage of your income is God calling you to give and what would it take to step up. This will be a year-long approach to stewardship focusing on giving as a calling from God.

Worship: Jim Woodruff was on vacation.

Staff: Nancy will be on vacation 2/16–21. Jenny will be doing the announcements and printing bulletins for the February 20 services.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

 Pandemic Advisory Group recommendations: Jenny reported that the PAG postponed their meeting from last week but will meet soon to address the way forward now that the local positivity test rate is falling, hopefully back to the low risk level. There are a number of considerations and the group is still discussing following guidelines from CDC, Boulder County DPH, and nationally well recognized epidemiologists. Please feel free to express your feelings and feedback from yourself and others to the group using the pag@bethlehem -lutheran.net email or speak with one of the members (Pr. Katie, Jenny, Dave Hooley, Carolyn Buck-Gengler, Laura Davis, or Matt James).

NEW BUSINESS

- New Council Member overview: Pr. Katie shared a Council Orientation document with links to important documents, especially the BLC Constitution and ByLaws, and information regarding council roles and responsibilities; she reviewed the new vision and mission statements and the ministry SMART goals, using the example of the SMART goal document for Missions' committee Social Justice Initiative. She encouraged each ministry chair to review their current SMART goal and think about updating for this year.
- Communications Committee Update: Greg reported a recommendation from the

Communications Committee that came up in discussion regarding hybrid meetings/ services (in-person and with zoom). Their recommendation is to purchase a dedicated computer that can be preloaded with all the required plug and play software and a dedicated camera to be used for such events with funds from memorial dollars. Greg and Matt will get together to work out the details for needs. Greg will contact the Memorial Fund Committee (Cindy Tayler, Gene Schnabel and Shirley Kasperbauer) so they can discuss the funding options.

- Fire Sprinkler System quote: Greg explained that the recent inspection revealed the need for updating the sprinkler system; the quote from the inspection company is \$11,160. Matt has requested more information regarding if the work can be done in pieces over the year but has not yet received a reply. This expense is coming, and the funds are available in the Capital Improvement Fund (which currently has approximately \$26,000). It was suggested that we get another quote for due diligence, and Alex will talk to his contact. Greg will pass on the information to Alex for follow up.
- Sanctuary Use Request: Nancy received a request for use of the sanctuary on two Saturdays for piano recitals but is still waiting for details on times, other equipment needs, etc. If details become available, we can address this request by an email vote. Pr. Katie will let us know.
- Nicaragua Project Request: Mark presented a special request from the Nicaragua Project for permission to request donations for a special housing project. This would only be an email to previous donors, not in the bulletin or Star.
- Mark moved to approve the request, and Jenny seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

 Sister Congregation Request: The Social Justice Initiative (SJI) would like to pursue adopting Pueblo De Dios Lutheran Church (ELCA) in Compton, California as a sister church. Our Faith Formation Director Gary Knutson has a personal connection with Pueblo De Dios and their pastor. The consensus of the council is that we need more research into the specific meaning and definition of the proposed relationship between the churches and into the expectations of each congregation. We would also like the SJI to invite the pastor of Pueblo De Dios for a zoom presentation for the SJI, council, and any other interested members as an introduction to Pueblo De Dios Lutheran Church and to the Pastor Samuel Neiva. This could be a wonderful educational and relational opportunity that would involve all ministries. Mark will discuss the information needed with the SJI.

Following prayer considerations and the Lord's prayer, this council meeting was adjourned at 8:48 p.m. Next Council meeting will be Tuesday, March 8, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. Exec meeting at 6:30 p.m.

Social Justice Initiative Update



Opportunities to Serve

During its January 2022 meeting, the Social Justice Initiative met to talk about plans for the coming year. Immigration and refugees remain important focus areas for the team, with needs that range from local to global.

As Lutherans, we have a long history of aiding and resettling refugees and asylum seekers. Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services (LIRS) is one of the premier organizations in the United States doing this work. It began in 1939 by aiding Europeans displaced by World War II and has expanded ever since. To learn more about how you can support LIRS and its work visit https://www.lirs.org.

Within Colorado, as 2,000 Afghan displaced refugees arrive in the state, the need for help is urgent. A small group of faith leaders met with Governor Jared Polis to brainstorm practical ways congregations can help Afghan refugees find places to live and adjust to their new lives. As a result of that meeting, Dave Runyan of cityunite.org and artofneigboring.com has suggested two outreach opportunities:

- The state has created an Amazon wish list that makes it easy to support Afghan refugees assigned to Colorado. Using the link below, you can purchase items that will be shipped directly to a refugee family in Colorado. https://www.amazon.com/hz/wishlist/ls/536K2SGRN647? ref =wl share
- 2. Needs for housing in the Denver metro area is at the top of the list. Each refugee family has a rent stipend. If you're able, consider offering your Airbnb, basement apartment, or rental property to refugees who are looking for a six to twelve month rental. To learn more, email crsp@state.co.us.
