Rev's Revelations



Through God's abundant **love** we invite, welcome, and serve as a light in the world.

On Epiphany Sunday, we received Star Words. In years past the words have come

from various bible verses or Christian themes and even other languages. This year, our Star Words come from the mission statement written by our Strategic Planning Team in 2020/21. While you ponder your word (and while I ponder mine), we will ponder together a new word each month. During April we will focus on **love**.

The word "love" appears 586 times throughout the entire NRSV translation of the bible. "Loved" appears another 112 times. "Loves," 71. Throughout the Old Testament "love" is often described as God's "steadfast love" for people.



"The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness." Exodus 34:6 "For [the LORD] is good, for his steadfast love endures forever." 2 Chronicles 7:3

There's an book of the bible consisting entirely of poetry between people in love--Song of Solomon.

And love is the purpose of Jesus and is Jesus' purpose for his disciples and friends:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." John 3:16

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." John 15:12-13

Love is so prevalent throughout the bible that Professor J. Michael Reu, who taught bible and theology classes at Wartburg Theological Seminary for a very long time, taught that, "The bible is God's love story for [hu] mankind."

And it is! From the very beginning God loved people through feast and famine, at home and in diaspora, when they bowed down in worship and even when they raised him up on the cross. God loved the world. And God loves the world.

We read those old stories about God's love and we see patterns of God's love (grace, mercy, faithfulness). While we don't have scribes accounting God's stories today (or do we?) we might recognize those patterns today. In the very least, we are called to make those patterns. We are called:

"Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection..." Romans 12:9-10 "Let all that you do be done in love." 1 Corinthians 16:14

"Lead a life...with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love..." Ephesians 4:1-2

As you ponder your own Star Word this month, also ponder love. When you read bible stories--how does God's love for the characters appear? When you watch the news--who is sharing God's love today--who is giving mercy, who is showing grace, who is faithful and to whom? Who needs love?

April 3 - Lent 5

Our God makes all things new. In the first reading God promises it. In the gospel Mary anticipates it, anointing Jesus' feet with costly perfume in preparation for the day of his burial. In baptism, God's new person (you!) rises daily from the deadly mire of trespasses and sins.

Readings: Isaiah 43:16-21, John 12:1-8

4/10 - Palm-Passion Sunday

Today we follow Christ from triumphal entry to the cross, each waypoint of the journey marked by Jesus' compassion for those who would betray, mock, accuse, or do violence to him. Though persecuted and beaten, Jesus the Son of God is not disgraced; instead, he asks forgiveness for those who put him to death. We have walked the Lenten pathway these forty days, each of us invited through baptism to "let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus." We enter this holy week accompanying Jesus to the cross with both grief and thanksgiving in our hearts, trusting in God's redeeming love.

4/17 - Easter

Today Christ is risen, and we gather together with astonishment and joy. Christ is risen, and we have been set free from the bonds of death. Christ is risen, and we are forgiven. Christ is risen, and with the women at the tomb and Peter, we are amazed. Let us rejoice: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

4/24 - Easter 2

In spite of all we have heard and all we have seen, it is often hard to believe. Because it is hard to believe, we will invest ourselves in the Easter mystery for fifty days (a week of weeks). Because it is hard to believe, John the evangelist will provide sign after sign celebrating Jesus' victory over death. Because it is hard to believe, the risen Jesus will return to us again and again in the mystery of holy communion, inviting us to touch and taste his presence, and offering us his peace.

Readings: John 20:19–31, Revelation 1:4–8

Council Meeting



Summary of the Council Meeting Minutes: March 8, 2022

Matt James called the meeting to order at 7:08 p.m. Attending: Pr.

Katie Chullino, Matt James, Steve Dawson, Jenny Kelley, Greg Schumann, Jamie Updegraff, Jim Woodruff; Absent: Alex Hoime, Todd Propp, Cindy Tayler, Mark Holste.

Following a devotion led by Pr. Katie, we prayed a special prayer for Lutheran Social Services and their mission to help settle refugees.

The minutes from the February 8, 2022, meeting were approved via email and posted in the library. In addition, the minutes of the special meeting on March 2, 2022, to address the new PAG guidelines were approved via email and posted in the library.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Greg reported that February income is only \$115 dollars below budget for General Fund; expenses are below budget due to set asides for two positions currently open (Worship/Music Director and nursery attendant) plus we have a quarterly insurance payment due in March. He reports no major concerns and is working on making the financial summary more readable and will transfer the January and February budgeted funding for the Capital Improvement Fund. Jim moved to approve the financial report as presented; Steve seconded. The motion was approved unanimously.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS: Pastor/Staff: Pr. Katie reports now being able to do more planning and pastoral work. We will need more volunteers in order to plan for possible communion at the rail after a few weeks of green status; we also need more worship assistant leaders, especially coordinators. It was suggested to see if anyone is willing to help plan an Easter Sunrise service and to consider an outdoor service for a safer option.

Faith Formation: Jamie highlighted her recent committee meeting and the emphasis on reconnecting with families; Gary has done a great job so far, and the team is supporting

those efforts; the summer calendar is getting filled with possibilities; the Easter Egg hunt for kids is scheduled for Saturday, April 6, with refreshments, crafts and free-will donations. This year appears to be a good time for reset—looking to keep those things that worked well and, for others, maybe try some new ideas.

Worship: Jim reported that worship teams are good with both hybrid and no-masks situations; there are some problems with recruiting worship assistant coordinators, with a need for communion assistants, ushers, acolytes, and altar guild/sacristy volunteers. He is happy to brainstorm ideas.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

 (None, since the PAG guidelines were addressed in the March 2, 2022 meeting.)

NEW BUSINESS

- Fireside Room Team: We need to address the condition of our Fireside Room in order to make it more welcoming and appropriate for families to gather before funerals and other events. We have volunteers to go through all the books/materials; we also need new furniture. We can borrow chairs from the fellowship hall or sanctuary for the short term. Consensus of the council is to move forward with the cleanup and reorganization and contact the memorial committee to consider those funds for new tables and chairs.
- Sharing the Grace event: Mark discussed another Share the Grace event to benefit those affected by the Marshall Fire in his report. Jenny moved to approve Mark's proposal for Share the Grace event on Palm Sunday and through Holy Week; Greg seconded, and the motion was approved unanimously.

Following prayer concerns and the Lord's Prayer, the meeting was adjourned by Matt at 8:15 p.m. The next Council meeting will be Tuesday, April 12, 2022 @ 7:00 p.m. Exec meeting will be at 6:30 p.m.

All donations will go to Sister Carmen Community Center -- the distribution center for people affected by the Marshall Fire.

Items of greatest need include:

- Gift cards for King Soopers and Walmart in \$10 and \$20 increments
- Cash in any amount
- Pantry items: olive oil, sugar, spices
- Condiments: ketchup, mayonnaise, mustard
- Nut butters: peanut, almond, cashew
- Household items: dish soap, laundry soap, cleaners
- Fruit: jam or jelly, canned fruit, applesauce
- Canned tomatoes: diced, paste, spaghetti sauce
- Canned beans: black, pinto, refried
- Protein: tuna, salmon, canned chicken

We'll be collecting items on at the front of the church on Palm Sunday and will also have a drive-through drop-off area behind the church from 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. There will also be a link on the donation page of the Bethlehem church website where people can donate online directly to this cause.

In addition to this collection, Bethlehem will be supporting Christ the Servant and Trinity Lutheran churches the week of April 10-16 through their "Connect. Pray. Love." program.
