Rev's Revelations



Through God's abundant love we invite, welcome, and serve as a light in the world.

Throughout this year, we have pondered our mission statement--one "star word" at a time. This month, we continue to meditate on the

last phrase in the statement as a light in the world.

Light is part of God's story from the very beginning--God created light in Genesis 1. Throughout the Old and New Testaments, light is a symbol of life and brings hope. When the Strategic Planning Team met in 2020 they recognized light as a symbol of God's own self, stating

The star over Bethlehem shone as a visible sign of God's presence in the world (Matthew 2).

I encourage you to open up to Matthew 2:1-12. Read through the story of Jesus--who is called *Emmanual* which means *God with us*. Consider the magi, who traveled by the light of a star, to encounter God with us in the world. Think about how the light guided them. Imagine what they found in the stable at Bethlehem. Notice how the magi were overwhelmed with joy and they gave gifts! Perhaps one of the most profound parts of this story is that they changed their plans--they took a different path home--because of what that great light shone.

As you think about *light* as it appears in the world today, ponder this month:

If a light shone on OUR Bethlehem, what would it illuminate?
What do you see in this congregation and community?
What gives you joy?
What gifts do you give?
How are you changed by what you see?

October 2 - 17th Sunday after Pentecost

A little faith goes a long way is Jesus' point in the gospel. A mustard seed's-worth of faith has miraculous potential. The patience, tenacity, and endurance required for the life of faith are the blessings received in holy baptism, holy communion, and the word read and proclaimed in this assembly. Anticipate them. Receive them with thanksgiving.

Readings: *Habakkuk 1:1-4, 2:1-4, Luke 17:5-10*

October 9 - 18th Sunday after Pentecost

It's a miracle! Multiple miracles! The waters of holy baptism have healed us. The body and blood of Jesus in holy communion have made us clean. We have died with Christ and been raised with him. For all this we have returned to offer thanks. From this place we are sent on our way rejoicing to share the good news. Readings: 2 Kings 5:1-3, 7-15c, Luke 17:11-19

October 16 - 19h Sunday after Pentecost

Pray always. Do not lose heart. This is Christ's encouragement in the gospel today. Wrestle with the word. Remember your baptism again and again. Come regularly to Christ's table. Persistence in our every encounter with the divine will be blessed.

Readings: Genesis 32:22-31, Luke 18:1-8

October 23 - 20th Sunday after Pentecost

Genuine repentance and pretentious piety stand in stark contrast in the gospel and all around us. All creation stands in need of God's forgiveness. Keep the faith. God's people shall be accounted righteous for Jesus' sake. Our God is merciful to sinners. For this we worship and glorify God forever.

Readings: *Jeremiah 14:7-10, 19-22; Luke 19:9-14*

Council Meeting

Council Meeting Summary for September 13, 2022

Matt James called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. Attending: Pr. Katie Chullino, Matt James, Jenny Kelley, Greg Schumann, Alex Hoime (late), Mark Holste, Cindy Tayler, Jamie Updegraff, and Jim Woodruff. Absent: Steve Dawson, Todd Propp.

For our devotional, Pr. Katie continued with Star Words and a focus on light—this month we are talking about the star over Bethlehem as a visible presence of God in the world (Matthew 2). If a light/star shown on our Bethlehem, what would it illuminate?

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Minutes from the last meeting were approved by email and posted in the library. There were several email votes last month:

- 1) On August 10, Pr. Katie moved to approve the request from LCM-CU (Pastor Zach Parris and Pastor Paul Judson) to use Josephine on October 8 for a campus ministry history tour in Boulder. Paul Judson would be driving. Matt seconded the motion. The motion passed with seven yes votes.
- 2) On August 16, Pr. Katie moved to approve the request from the Girl Scouts to hold a garage sale on the Saturday of Labor Day Weekend. Mark seconded the motion. The motion was approved with nine yes votes.
- 3) On August 18, a combined meeting of the PAG, LOC Council, and BLC council met and proposed new Covid-19 guidelines based on recent CDC recommendations. The BLC council voted: Cindy moved to approve the new Mitigation Chart and procedures as written; Mark seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously by both the PAG and the BLC council.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Greg reports we are down about \$10,000 in general giving; this trend is up and down and hard to understand. He hopes the stewardship drive will help members realize we need consistent contributions. Spending is down and almost the



same as last year. Reminders: we do not yet have the music/worship director position filled and that would have added another \$10,000 deficit; significant capital expenditures are still coming; and budget preparation is coming up so get the mates to Greg; he will provide each ministry

estimates to Greg; he will provide each ministry with last year's budget information to make any adjustments.

Cindy moved to accept the financial report as submitted; Jim seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

Pastor / Staff / Ministry: Pr. Katie referred to her written report and updated work of several teams. She and the evangelism committee are looking at a community after school snack idea and have some volunteers interested. A Land Use committee has been formed: Matt James, Greg Schumann, Chili Chullino, Glen Summers, Sandy Burrell, Pr. Katie, Felicia (neighbor), Fr. Teri/LOC, Tory (Apt manager), and a Growing Gardens representative. A Columbarium team had its first meeting; the Preschool team is working on updating several documents. The Nominating committee has met and already has a full slate for the executive committee. Pr. Katie also reminded members to sign up for the RMS town hall conference gathering on November 12, 9:00-11:00 a.m. at First Lutheran.

Evangelism: Cindy reported evangelism continues and is celebrating the Dining for Eight fall meetings. She gives special thanks to the AV team for their hard work. The team is working with Pr. Katie on the After School Snack Program. Another goal is to get back to active shepherding groups.

Faith Formation: Jamie highlighted recent Faith Formation events, Sunday School and Adult Forum plus Confirmation classes are back. The team is focusing on new verbiage: 'generations to generations' for the education hour. A family event is scheduled for September 24, and in October, Family Sunday programs will begin. Thank-you's include the Faith Formation Forum Facilitators Team (volunteers for Adult Forum) and Sue Smith (keeping the VBS budget lower than budgeted).

Council Meeting (con't)

Missions: Mark highlighted the recent Habitat for Humanity build and Naomi Circle provided lunch. He referred to his report on God's Work. Our Hands. Sunday that was on September 11.

Property: Alex followed up on the sprinkler service and two backflow issues; timeline for repairs dependent on Western States. Property signs are needed for the parking lots and building due to the increase in people "camping" on the property; signs and details are in preparation. Tires on the bus were replaced. Alex thanks Ed Schlactenhaufen and Todd Propp for the preschool cleanup.

Stewardship: Todd was absent and submitted a report. He is looking for one more volunteer for the upcoming stewardship campaign.

Worship: Jim reported there are still difficulties with scheduling due to illness, travel, etc. One Sunday had 25 worship volunteers unavailable. Who will participate in a choir? Who will increase support to fund a choir director? Sending out a questionnaire for who is interested in participating is a first step. Thanks to volunteers.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Preschool Committee / Board: see Pr. Katie's report above.
- Land Use Dream Team: see Pr. Katie's report above

NEW BUSINESS

- SJI requested approval for this October's Share the Grace project: Mark moved to approve the October Share the Grace Sunday; Cindy seconded. The motion was approved unanimously.
- Signs: LOC requested to put a banner next to preschool sign on the fence and/or 'floaty' sign which would be put out before services. After discussion, the council agreed by consensus.
- After School Snack Program
- Jenny Kelley requested approval with the Executive Council for a facility use request from Gregg Hansen and Community Drums for use of the Pavillion, Stable, and/or Fellowship Hall on Sunday afternoons from

2:00 to 5:00 p.m. beginning October 9. Gregg has offered to provide a drum concert and community drum circle for a fundraising event that would support the Community After School Snack Program through free will donations. He is happy to work with us on the details.

- Cindy moved to approve the drum fundraiser; Greg seconded. Details to be worked out quickly. Date TBD (Note: The date has now been set for October 16 with a concert at 2:00 pm and the community drum circle at 3:00 pm.) The motion was approved unanimously.
- Annual Meeting is on December 11 (need bylaw changes; need budget, need annual report)
- Annual Reports due November 13; due to congregation December 4.
- Budget information due November 13 or before!

Update on site security: There has been a large increase in people staying overnight in the parking lot or stable. Pr. Katie gave a reminder to be safe and be kind; never talk to someone alone. We can offer coffee and ask how they are; inform them they cannot stay and must leave. If the situation seems okay, they can use the restrooms and maybe obtain a King Soopers card, plus resource information card from the office. No alcohol or drugs at any time. It is okay to call the police if you feel they are needed. Note: Longmont police do not automatically take homeless people to jail; they will call social services, etc., and try to place individuals in supportive situations.

Outdoor Schedule: The consensus is that the second service will move inside as of October 2, 2022.

Following prayer concerns and the Lord's prayer, Matt adjourned the meeting at 9:00 p.m. Next Council meeting will be Tuesday, October 11, 2022 @ 7:00 p.m. Exec meeting is at 6:30 p.m.

Hope for the Holidays!

Yes! We are really posting a Christmas image! It is time to announce our "Hope for the Holidays" Christmas card signing for the thousands of people detained in prison-like settings throughout the US. These people (25,000 in September) are waiting for court hearings on their requests for asylum or for protection from torture and abuse. Their Christmas experience will not be with family or friends, and it will not be warm and cozy. Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services (LIRS) coordinates an effort to gather

Christmas cards to be distributed to all the detention centers in the hopes of reaching every single detained person with a Christmas greeting of hope. Last



year our church members signed 230 cards that were sent to LIRS to join with cards from other Lutheran congregations across the country, eventually reaching most of the detainees. You can provide HOPE by stopping at the tables in the fover on November 6 and 13. Everything you need in order to share some hope will be provided cards, pens, suggestions for phrasing your supportive wishes, information on the detention process. You are also welcome to write greetings on cards at home and drop them off at the tables. No last names, and no envelopes please. Greetings in Spanish are also welcome! come share some HOPE FOR THE HOLIDAYS!



Pumpkin Cinnamon Roll Cookies

Ingredients (makes 6 dozen)

- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 1 1/4 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 4 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2/3 cup pumpkin puree
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 4 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon active dry yeast
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Glaze:

- 1 1/2 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 tablespoons milk

Instructions

- In a small bowl, mix together the brown sugar, 2 teaspoons cinnamon, and 2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice. Set aside.
- With a mixer, cream together the butter, cream cheese, and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs, pumpkin puree, and vanilla extract. In another bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, dry yeast, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves, and salt. Gradually add the dry mixture to the wet until just combined.
- 3. Divide the dough into four equal parts. On a lightly floured surface, roll each into an 8x6-inch rectangle. Sprinkle each with about 3 tablespoons of the brown sugar mixture. Roll up tight starting with a long side. Wrap in plastic and refrigerate for 1 hour or until firm.
- 4. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees F. Cut the dough into 3/8-inch slices. Place 1 inch apart on a greased (or parchment-lined) baking sheet. Bake 10-12 minutes or until the bottoms of the cookies are light brown. Remove from the sheet pan and allow to completely cool on a wire rack.
- In a small bowl, whisk together the glaze ingredients. (Add more milk if needed, one teaspoon at a time, to create a thin glaze.) Dip the tops of the cookies into the glaze. Let stand until set. Store in an airtight container.
