Every year, Advent orients us around preparation and waiting. Often, we pick themes to set our hearts and minds on the right things--because it can be pretty easy to wait for Santa or to prepare for Christmas

dinner while we forget that the season is about Jesus the Christ coming into our lives today. This year, we center ourselves with the theme: *From Generation to Generation.* The theme comes from Mary's song, the Magnificat,

Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed:

for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

His mercy is for those who fear him **from generation to generation**. (Luke 1:48-50)

As we worship this Advent, we will hear sacred scriptures about the Messiah, Christ, Emmanuel. We will learn about the ancestors of Jesus. And we will consider how much more generation means to us and for the future.

A Sanctified Art, the publisher of this Advent series, beautifully explains how much more generation can mean, "The root word of 'generation' is 'gen' meaning 'origin' or 'birth.' Our theme is also a call to action: what are we being called to generate or bring forth? What have your ancestors and those who have come before you passed on for you to continue? Who are the spiritual elders in your community who planted the seeds for things that are now blooming? What seeds are you planting

From Generation to Generation... reminds us of the ways our lives, histories, actions, and stories are interconnected and woven together...This Advent may you remember that you belong--to a story etched into the wrinkles of time, to generations that

have come before and will come after, to a love that won't let you go."

As you read this month's *Star* newsletter and see all of the opportunities to engage, consider those questions above and do more than consider--be! Be you. Be blessed. Be a blessing! Live out your part in the story here and now!

<u>December 4, 2022 - Second Sunday in</u> Advent

When the angel Gabriel comes to Mary, she is perplexed and confused—and no doubt, afraid. And yet, the angel's news is: "Do not be afraid." Do not be afraid. We hear this refrain all throughout the Christmas story and remember it is the most common phrase in all the bible. From generation to generation, God shows up in the midst of our fear and uncertainty and confusion. From generation to generation, faithful people have said, "yes," despite apprehension. From generation to generation, our ancestors in faith have accepted the invitation. The prophecy in Isaiah paints a vision of what we work toward when we say "yes": righteousness and equity reign, the wolf lives with the lamb, no harm or hurt shall destroy the earth, a child shall lead the way. This is the vision passed down to us: we must pursue it and make it real.

<u>December 11, 2022 - Third Sunday in</u> <u>Advent</u>

As far as Joseph knows, his new wife has been unfaithful to him and broken their marriage contract. And yet, instead of punishment, he chooses not to publicly disgrace or humiliate her. This interruption in his life becomes a holy invitation when the angel comes to him in a dream and says, "Do not be afraid." When he awakes, Joseph once again has the courage to choose a better way. He chooses to stay with Mary, to become an adoptive parent. He chooses peace over violence, grace over condemnation. Like Mary, he chooses to say "yes." When have our ancestors also chosen a better way, and when have they not? Isaiah 35 is a vision of what happens when we choose a better way: the wilderness blooms, water breaks forth in the desert, eyes are opened, ears are unstopped, sorrow and sadness flee away. A highway shall appear and it will become a holy way.

<u>December 18, 2022 - Fourth Sunday in Advent - Good News Singers?</u>

This week we return to Mary's experience. After receiving the news from the angel, she retreats to her cousin Elizabeth's house. When Mary arrives (perhaps unannounced). Elizabeth doesn't just welcome her—she is filled with the Holy Spirit and speaks a blessing upon Mary as her own child leaps and kicks within her womb. She sees how God is at work and names it out loud. In this moment of profound solidarity, Mary and Elizabeth see the divine in one another. This connection inspires Mary to sing her radical hymn of praise, declaring how God's liberating love remains steadfast throughout the ages. From generation to generation, we can see how God is at work in our relationships. We find God in each other. The way we see the divine in each other impacts how we live and move in the world. When we view every human being as a child of God, we generate a different world.

<u>December 25, 2022 - Christmas Day - 1 Service at 9:15 am</u>

"And the Word became flesh and lived among us..." (John 1:14a). Unlike the other gospels, John's gospel offers us a cosmic glimpse of Christ's birth. Christ's beginning was with God, therefore, Christ has been with us since life began. On this Christmas Sunday, we celebrate the many ways God dwells with us from generation to generation, since the beginning of time. Like Mary pondering the angels' message in her heart, we invite you to dwell in your worship, perhaps embracing stillness, contemplative practices, creativity, and prayer. In the fullness of this season, come dwell with God—in silence or in song, in prayer or in stillness.

<u>January 1, 2022 - Epiphany Sunday - 1 Service at 9:15 am</u>

The Magi were seekers. They sought wisdom, they sought the divine, they sought fortunes to tell the future. Their seeking leads them to Jesus, the newborn king of another culture and religion. And yet, their seeking is also what protects them from Herod's deception and harm. After the Magi go home by another way, Joseph is visited again by an angel in his dream. This time, the angel brings a warning, and like before, Joseph heeds the message. Fleeing from Herod's massacre, Joseph, Mary, and baby Jesus seek refuge in Egypt; they remain there, living as immigrants, until Herod dies. Like the Magi, may we seek the divine and be willing to journey closer to God. Like the Holy Family, may we seek safety for all families who are under threat. This new year and every year to come, let us keep seeking— wisdom, justice, and a better world.

Council Meeting

Council Meeting Minutes Summary November 08, 2022 - approved

CALL TO ORDER: Matt James called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

Attending: Pr. Katie Chullino, Matt James, Jenny Kelley, Steve Dawson, Greg Schumann, Mark Holste, Todd Propp, Cindy Tayler, Jamie Updegraff, Jim Woodruff, Cindy Tayler. Absent: Alex Hoime.

DEVOTIONS AND PRAYER: Pr. Katie shared an image from our Advent resources based on Matthew 1:1-17 (Jesus' genealogy) representing Christ as a rose in the center surrounded by significant women who supported his life. Questions to consider: what do you hold in your circle? How would you ensure the continuation of Christ today?

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Minutes of the October meeting were approved via email and posted in the library. On October 31, 2022, Exec approved Timberline quote for \$1,434.00 to replace broken furnace motor. A reminder for ministry chairs, committee members, and staff: Sunday, November 27—Annual Report submissions are due. Send them to secretary@bethlehem-lutheran.net.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Greg reports giving was down again for the month of October. We are doing well at keeping expenses down in the general fund. We have not filled the Worship Director position so we automatically reduce our expenses by \$1,500 per month. General Fund giving this month was below budget by \$6.827 in the month of October. General Fund expenses were under budget by \$9,846. For the year 2022 we are \$59,782 below budget in General Fund giving and \$40,362 under budget in General Fund expenditures. The General Fund is essentially what runs the church. Remind folks that if they have financial questions, seek out the Congregation Treasurer or a member of the financial team.

Budget preparation is underway—Greg needs budget estimates from all ministry areas; the

congregation budget meeting is November 20 between services.

Cindy moved to approve the financial report as presented; Todd seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS (Pastor/Staff): Pr. Katie was thankful for the Djembe concert fundraiser and will send a letter of gratitude to Gregg Hanson of Community Drums; we raised close to \$1500 for the after school program. There are some potential team leaders and preliminary plans which Cindy, Pr. Katie, and Jenny will follow up; the goal is to begin the program in January. There is a lot of Advent/ Christmas stuff so we need volunteers of all ages; we will be trying out an online process for signing up volunteers. For the Thanksgiving service on 11/22, Bethlehem will provide pies and readers—will be a signup in weekly emails.

Stewardship: Todd reported that preparations for the Consecration Sunday are going well, although many did not understand the reservation card. Pr. Josh Walker is the guest pastor. The Estimate of Giving cards will be passed out during service and collected by the ushers before dismissal. An online option for those who cannot come to church on that day is also available from our website.

Todd plans to focus on the Time & Talents survey after the campaign.

Evangelism: Cindy reported Living Nativity signups are in the narthex and online; Cindy will talk to Tiffany about FaceBook posts, notify other churches, and put an ad in the Times Call, along with Christmas service information. Upcoming projects include the after school program and planning for a new photo directory.

Missions: Mark reported on the recent Habitat for Humanity work day with a special thanks to Bob C. The Share the Grace event on October 30 was very successful with clothing, toiletries, backpacks, snacks, gift cards, and cash collected for Casa de Paz and The Reentry Initiative. Upcoming is a Thanksgiving service and pies at New Beginnings.

Worship: Jim reported that he is planning for holidays and thanks all for his time on council

Council Meeting (con't)

Faith Formation: Jaime highlighted events from her report. Advent plans: Family Advent Nights which will include dinners. The Christmas program will be on December 18 between services.

Property: Alex was absent.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

- Preschool Committee / Board: Pr. Katie reported the next meeting is scheduled for Jan. 9. Jenny will send out a link to the document draft for the updated BLC Personnel Handbook to the council for comments.
- Land Stewardship Team: Matt reported that Growing Gardens came and did a walk around; Chili is scheduling a follow up meeting.
- Stewardship Campaign: see above under Stewardship.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Church Van: Matt moved to approve the authorization to sell the church Toyota van for \$4000 with \$3000 down and the remainder allowed to be \$100 per month due until paid off; the funds from this sale will go into the Capital Improvement Fund. Greg seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously.
- AA New Year's Eve building use: An AA group that has used our facility before has requested use of our Fellowship Hall for a sober New Year's Eve party; Mike Smith is willing to be the church contact person. Todd moved that we authorize the group to use the Fellowship Hall for their New Year's Eve party; Jenny seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously. Pr. Katie will follow up with the group for the usual facility use paperwork.
- Annual meeting/position hand off plan: Pr.
 Katie asks outgoing council members to
 meet with new members to pass off
 information, etc. The December meeting will
 have both old and new members present to
 facilitate the exchange of information.

- AMP Paw Giving Tree: Council discussed a request to bring in a tree with paw cards for presents during the month of December and suggested that this would be better in February since it would not conflict with other planned holiday requests.
- Nicaragua Project: Mark requested approval for the annual winter challenge in December for the Nicaragua Project; Greg seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.
- Mark moved to approve a Hygiene Supplies & Food Drive for the Our Center in conjunction with the Living Nativity; Cindy seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

Following prayer considerations and the Lord's Prayer, Matt adjourned the meeting at 8:27 p.m.

Nicaragua Project

Marta, one of our children center directors, just sent us the following story:

"Five year old Pedro Pablo Rivera used to collapse on the ground, depressed and weak, not able to will himself back up. Many days he had nothing to eat. Other days he had only a piece of a tortilla shared with his three siblings as well as his 68 year old grandmother who is the sole provider for all of them. Although she is in very bad health, she gets up each morning at 1:00 to sweep the streets and earn a dollar after a night of work in order to provide even a small amount

of food for her four grandchildren. Our children's project staff brought Pedro to the preschool some months ago. At first, he was so weak he could not play or eat. They continued to encourage and build him up with food and loving care and slowly but surely, Pedro is literally rising up, strengthening, and coming back to life."

You can make a difference in Pedro's life and 83 young children like him at our children's center with a generous donation that will allow the center to continue to feed and nourish them.


Bell Ringing Volunteers Needed

Gluten Free "Lutheran Cookies"

These "Lutheran Cookies" were shared by Father Teri as a thank you after Nancy T's assistance one particularly busy week this fall. Everyone in the building enjoyed them and per request, Fr. Teri shared her recipe:

Blend:

1 stick softened butter 1/2 cup white sugar 1/2 cup brown sugar 1 egg 2 tsp vanilla

Add:

1 1/2 cups gf flour 1/2 tsp baking soda 1/2 tap baking powder 1/4 tsp salt M&M's



Once mixed, refrigerate for half an hour. Then make balls and put on parchment lined baking sheet. Cook at 350F degrees for 12-13 minutes. They are fragile right out of the oven so don't touch them for about five minutes. Cool on a baking rack.

The key is my flour. King Arthur Gluten Free Flour (see photo).

Put them in an old Easter basket and deliver. I am going to call them Lutheran cookies from now on since you all seemed to like them even though they are gluten-free.
