Rev's Revelations



Cruzando Fronteras: Part 2

Last month, I wrote to you with anticipation for the 2023 Rocky Mountain Synod Assembly Cruzando Fronteras which means crossing borders. While the business of the assembly was pretty much as expected (budget, elections, etc.), this year we did something we had never done before: we went on border immersions. Our assembly delegates, Sue and Mike, visited a processing center while I visited a shelter. You can hear about the immersions that Sue, Mike and I went on in our worship service

on Sunday, May 21 (https://tinyurl.com/BLCSA2023). We learned a lot about immigration, immigrants, and stories from various people in the process including border patrol agents, asylum seekers, social services, and church volunteers. One of the biggest takeaways was that each of their stories are real and each of their stories are related to our story as followers of Christ.

You may recall the quote from the assembly speaker Rev. Dr. David Vasquez Levy, "Immigration is not an issue, but a reality that shapes over 100 million people and because we are called to be people of God and God cares about people we will care about this." What you may not have heard—especially, if you are new to the community—is that we have cared about this for a very long time. In 1982—back in the days of Pastor Sather—Sophan and Vanny Heng and their two children were resettled from Cambodia to Longmont by Bethlehem Lutheran Church through the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service. In 1983, BLC and the new Pastor Isernhagen wrote to Congressman Tim



Wirth regarding the immigration case for Vanny's brother and worked to have him brought from France and reunited with his family in Longmont.

No doubt, our world has changed since the 1980s. But people have not. We still live through movement. Moving from home to school/work. Moving from worship to fellowship. Moving from learning to action. And we still care about those who move around us—because as God's people we are called to care for friends, for neighbors, for strangers—even for our enemies.

Out of that care for God's people an Immigration Focus Group formed at BLC out of our Missions ministry in early 2023. The intent was to learn more about immigration today. Soon, people from other ELCA congregations and Light of Christ joined the conversation. Discussion has included learning about immigration issues, immigrants, and how our congregations might meet neighbors where they are (through ministries like the Nicaragua project) and where they are moving (through community programs like Casa de Paz in Denver and Cristo Rey in El Paso). Last month, the BLC Council approved the planning of an immersion trip to Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey in El Paso—like the immersions at Synod Assembly—for this group! Having just spent days on the border, I am excited to return and learn more about the complicated realities of life for our friends at the border and I'm even more excited to invite you to be part of the trip!

The trip is an immersion. This means it's not a traditional mission trip and it's also not a sightseeing trip. The trip is not a mission to evangelize or to fix problems in any area. The trip is not focused on the agenda of one political party or another and it's not even about whether immigration is legal or illegal, right or wrong. This immersion trip gives people the ability to see life at the border and learn about immigration in El Paso firsthand not through the news or through your uncle's opinion at Thanksgiving. I highly encourage you to consider participating in the trip and/or supporting your church friends to go and bring back stories to share. If you want to learn more about Cristo Rey and programs before committing, please visit their website (https://iglesiacristorey.wixsite.com/luterana). If you're interested in going on the trip, please contact Cathy G. (cegood47@aol.com). There will also be opportunities to donate supplies for Cristo Rey as well as funds for both trip scholarships and a donation to Cristo Rey programs.

Whether or not you are interested in the trip, you are welcome to learn more during Immigration Facts and Myths, a potluck and presentation on July 12, led by Christ the Servant Lutheran Church member and immigration attorney Cathy Brown at Bethlehem. She will explore facts and myths about immigration laws and challenge us to think, "What would Jesus do?"

This is a human reality and it is part of our reality. I am ever grateful to learn and live this together.

Sunday Worship

Sunday, June 4, 2023

The word trinity is not found in the scriptures—though the understand of a multifaceted God is. In Matthew's gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith. **Readings**: Genesis 1:1–2:4a, Matthew 28:16–20

Sunday, June 11, 2023

Though Jesus was a devout Jew who practiced his faith, he was criticized for eating with tax collectors and sinners—the religiously non-observant. Jesus criticizes the self-righteous and reminds us that mercy is to be at the heart of our religious practices. God continues to be made known in those on the margins of society, like Matthew the tax collector and the hemorrhaging woman. As we gather each Lord's day we receive the healing that makes us well and sends us forth to be signs of God's mercy for the world.

Readings: Hosea 5:15–6:6, Matthew 9:9–13, 18–26

Sunday, June 18, 2023

Jesus sends out the disciples as laborers into the harvest. In baptism we too are anointed for ministry, sharing God's compassion with our needy world. From the Lord's table we go forth to proclaim the good news, to heal the sick, and to share our bread with the hungry.

Reading: Matthew 9:35–10:23



Sunday, June 25, 2023

Jesus declares that his words may bring stark division. Even so, we need not be afraid for God accounts for each hair on our heads. Though we may experience rejection, frustration, division, and death, God's grace and love make us a new creation each day. Marked with the cross and filled with holy food, we are sent from worship to witness to Christ in the world. **Readings**:

Jeremiah 20:7–13. Matthew 10:24–39

Sunday, July 2, 2023

The welcome of baptism is for all God's children. This baptismal gift sets us free from the power of sin and death. In today's gospel, Christ promises that the disciple who gives a cup of cold water to the little ones serves Christ himself. From worship we are sent on our baptismal mission: to serve the little ones of this world and to be a sign of God's merciful welcome. **Readings**: Jeremiah 28:5–9, Romans 6:12–23, Matthew 10:40–42

CALL TO ORDER: Mark Holste called the meeting to order at 7:21pm.

Living Our Faith in the Community: Member Hi-Light.

Dave T. has been on the Nicaragua Project board as well as the website developer and coordinator for the Nicaragua Project for 13 years. More recently, he has also been helping with finances. On the trips themselves, he not only helped fit reading glasses at clinics, but also helped build up and maintain a computer lab at the preschool. Please read his story below.

The Nicaragua Project

Before I retired, I always thought I should donate time and money for the Nicaragua project, but there never seemed to be enough of either. After I retired, I decided I would go on the Nicaragua mission trip, but for multiple reasons I became more apprehensive the closer the date came. Nevertheless. I had committed so I decided I would go. We stayed at a motel right across from the airport in Managua the first night. In the morning, I discovered that Nicaragua has great coffee and I ended up having way too much at breakfast. The trip to Somoto was about four hours long and I was miserable almost the whole bus ride. At the time, I really wished I had not signed-up for the trip. We finally arrived in Somoto where we went to the preschool for the children to perform their welcoming program for us.

While walking up to the preschool from the base of a small hill, this little girl grabbed my hand, looked up and smiled at me. Luckily for me, Sarah Anderson, our intern pastor that year who was fluent in Spanish, was walking with me. I used Sarah as a translator and found out that the little girl's name was Carolina. She was 10 years old, lived with her parents, a younger sister and brother in one of the houses we had built a previous year. Her smile was as if God was telling me, "Don't worry, Dave. You're going to have a wonderful trip." And indeed it was. I have returned to Somoto eight times and have provided scholarships for Carolina and one of her friends. After seeing the deplorable situations in which many are living and yet how joyful they are, I decided that I could help a lot more. And so I have.

The Nicaragua Project is having their annual June matching fund-drive to feed, educate, protect 85 preschoolers and 50 older children living in abject poverty. Please consider a generous donation. (Details on page 10)


