Rev's Revelations

Do you know God's name? I bet you're going to answer *Yahweh* or *Lord* or *I Am.* But, it's not any of those. It's Andy, of course! "Andy walks with me, Andy talks with me, Andy tells me I am his own!" That was one of my grandma's favorite jokes—and songs. I imagine her telling it every Wednesday this Lenten season as we gather in the garden for *Conversations with Jesus.* I giggle a little, I miss her a little. And then I think about the rest of the song...

I come to the garden alone
While the dew is still on the roses;
And the voice I hear, falling on my ear,
The Son of God discloses.

And he walks with me, and he talks with me, And he tells me I am his own, And the joy we share as we tarry there, None other has ever known...

I understand why she liked the song: it reminds us that Jesus, our God incarnate, walks with us, talks with us, and claims us. Our God relates with us. I also struggle with the song. The last line of the the refrain, "none other has ever known." Sometimes, I hear it and think, "Really? I'm pretty sure others know God/Jesus." Sometimes I hear exclusiveness in that line—as if I, or we, know God and others don't—and that feels wrong.

But, I also hear that line and think, "Really, how awesome is it that no one knows God in the same way?" God walks with each of us and we each walk in different places. We talk about different things. We each know God differently.

This Lent we get to imagine how different character from the bible knew God in Jesus. As you listen to *Conversations in the Garden* this year, don't just imagine how those people back then knew God, but imagine how you know God and how those around you might know God, too.

Worship

Sunday, March 3 – 3rd Sunday in Lent: The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The commandments begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can become our gods. The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world. Readings: Exodus 20:1–17; John 2:13–22

Sunday, March 10 – 4th Sunday in Lent: The fourth of the Old Testament promises providing a baptismal lens this Lent is the promise God makes to Moses: those who look on the bronze serpent will live. In today's gospel Jesus says he will be lifted up on the cross like the serpent, so that those who look to him in faith will live. When we receive the sign of the cross in baptism, that cross becomes the sign we can look to in faith for healing, for restored relationship to God, for hope when we are dying. Readings: Numbers 21:4–9; John 3:14–21?

Sunday, March 17 – 5th Sunday in Lent: God promises Jeremiah that a "new covenant" will be made in the future: a covenant that will allow all the people to know God by heart. The church sees this promise fulfilled in Christ, who draws all people to himself when he is lifted up on the cross. Our baptismal covenant draws us to God's heart through Christ and draws God's love and truth into our hearts. We join together in worship, sharing in word, song, and meal, and leave strengthened to share God's love with all the world. Readings: Jeremiah 31:31–34; John 12:20–33

Sunday, March 24 – Palm Sunday: This week, the center of the church's year, is one of striking contrasts: Jesus rides into Jerusalem surrounded by shouts of glory, only to be left alone to die on the cross, abandoned by even his closest friends. Mark's gospel presents Jesus in his complete human vulnerability: agitated, grieved, scared, forsaken. Though we lament Christ's suffering and all human suffering, we also expect God's salvation: in the wine and bread, Jesus promises that his death will mark a new covenant with all people. We enter this holy week thirsty for the completion of God's astonishing work. Readings: Mark 11:1–11 (during gathering); Mark 14:1–15:47 dispersed throughout service.

Sunday, March 31 – Easter: Christ is risen! Jesus is alive, and God has swallowed up death forever. With Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, we may feel astonished and confused, unsure of what to make of the empty tomb. But this is why we gather: to proclaim, witness, praise, and affirm the liberating reality of Christ's death and resurrection. In word and feast, we celebrate God's unending love, and depart to share this good news with all the world. Alleluia! Readings: Mark 16:1–8

CALL TO ORDER: Mark Holste called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

ATTENDING: Pr. Katie Chullino, Mark Holste, Brian Carlson, Greg Schumann, Cindy Thompson, Cathy Goodman, Sabrina Lee, Paul Puebla, Mike Smith, Glenn Summers and Jaime Updegraff.

DEVOTIONS AND PRAYER: led by Pr. Katie.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: approved via email and posted.

FINANCIAL REPORT: General Fund giving this month was below budget by \$3,598. General Fund expenses were over budget by \$2,377. Greg asked Council to check their church email regularly (at least once a week) and remember that these emails may be passed on to the person who is in your position next. **Sabrina Lee moved to accept the financial report. Paul Puebla seconded. Motion carried.**

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS:

- Pastor/Staff: Lent begins. The garden is ready. Adult Forum begins this next Sunday. Visitation training went well. Communion at Alta Vita one Tuesday a month is going well. An musician is needed for two upcoming Sundays.
- Worship: Sabrina shared that from May 26 September 8 (Rally Day) there will be one service at 9:15am. Outdoor service will be the 3rd Sunday of the month. Set-up will be added to monthly signup. Council was in consensus with Worship Committee's recommended dates and times.
- Evangelism: Photo wall is still in progress. Continue to wear nametags at worship and encourage others. The ministry is still looking into a business directory with LOC.
- Faith Formation: Jaime highlighted this month's Tradition/Family Sunday where a murder mystery party was hosted with 40 participants. Gumbo, cornbread, and king cake were enjoyed. The Easter Extravaganza is scheduled for Saturday, March 30th from 10-12 which will include the Easter story, a hunt for Easter eggs, and lunch. The Faith Formation team will be stuffing eggs on Friday evening, March 29th, from 5-7. All are welcome! If you want to donate candy, please drop it off in Gary's office. Female mentors are needed for the confirmation mentoring program during Lent VBS will be the end of June. A preschool coordinator for VBS is needed.
- Mission: Cathy said the general planning meeting on January 21st for 2024 went well. An excellent committee was formed to look at revisions/name change. February 25th will be the first of two Share the Grace events. A motion to embrace the ELCA statement on accompaniment as the guiding values for Missions was passed unanimously. Council will work together on promoting this concept through worship, adult forum, etc.

- **Stewardship**: Mike shared offering plate giving was more than the same month a year ago. Stewardship would like to continue passing the plate through April and then evaluate the effectiveness/value of this procedure.
- **Property:** Glenn shared he will be meeting with snow removal tomorrow. Josephine is scheduled for a checkup. All other projects and maintenance repairs are highlighted in his report.

- Hopi Mission Trip Cathy Goodman moved that a pancake breakfast occur on Mother's Day: Sunday, May 12 with funds designated for the Hopi Mission trip. Sabrina Lee seconded. Motion carried.
- Fellowship Hall Usage: A local fencing program is looking for space and asked if Bethlehem would consider allowing them to use the fellowship hall for lessons M-F approximately 3:30-9:00. Council felt the fellowship hall space needs to be available for church sponsored events and declined the request at this time.
- 90th birthday celebration: Mark shared that a family wants to do a
 champagne toast at this birthday celebration. Since our building use policy
 does not allow alcohol, Council must approve such a request. Greg
 Schumann moved that an exception be make to building use policy for
 this birthday to occur and a champagne toast be allowed. Mike Smith
 seconded. Motion carried.
- Summer bake sale: A member of our congregation asked if their group could hold a bake sale at Bethlehem sometime this summer following Sunday worship. Council would like to reserve Sunday morning fundraising for church sponsored organizations. Pr. Katie will notify them of Council's decision.
- Office Hours: The Executive Committee discussed office hours and made the

 weekend. The phone system allows messages to be checked via email so
 needs after 1pm can be addressed.





Our initial plan was to lay low during COVID and spend as little of our savings as possible. That went well for the first year, then the market changed and we realized the best choice for our retirement plan, was to go back to work. Initially it was part-time, I was enjoying working as a barista at Stirlini Coffee Company. That delightful experience turned into a full-time sales position as a Brand Ambassador for their Premium Coffeehouse Cocktails. I was eagerly hoping to return to that position when we came home from our RV Resort in Fort Myers, Florida however a production issue caused a pause and then shut down of production. Anyone who had the pleasure of sampling those delicious Latte Cocktails knows that this was a sad day for owners, employees and connoisseurs of the products!

As a result of that shut down I updated my resume and began the search for a new job, hoping to land a similar role for a local liquor business. Much to my surprise I was contacted by a home healthcare employer for an interview. I spent some time praying about whether or not to even go to an interview? Then it was like I felt God tapping me on the shoulder, guiding me to accept when they requested an in person conversation about the role. My "30 minute interview" turned into a 2 hour caring conversation with the Manager about our families and how we had lost several of our dearest ones and became caregivers in the process. As I got up to leave the interviewer said, "you are meant to do this, and I look forward to watching your success and joy if you choose to come on board with us".

A few days later, after background checks, reference calls and salary discussions I was newly employed with Heartfelt Care! I had 1 full day of training and then several hours of online education before I was scheduled with my first client.

I was nervous and excited to meet this 90 year old "Brooklyn Jew" as she refers to herself.

After my first 12 hour shift with "V" I knew that God had a hand in our meeting! She is funny, engaging, grateful, sassy and full of love for her family and her late husband. After a couple more shifts I realized that I had found my happy place! A job where I can share my caregiving skills (acquired from the master, my beautiful mom Jan) and my patience (a gift from my kind and patient father, Bud) to add quality, safety and fun to "V's" life while finding joy and the opportunity to spend these wonderful days with a surrogate mom who I didn't have the chance to enjoy in her twilight years. "V's" sense of humor, her joy at seeing me arrive for work, her ability to make me laugh and her unique choices in culinary creations have added so much to my life! I know I am blessed and God has put this opportunity in my life for a reason. I wasn't sure if I really had the right gifts to be able to do caregiving as a job, but I am certain now that this is where I am supposed to be. Blessed to be a blessing!
