

Worship

May 5 – Sixth Sunday of Easter

(Pastor Paul Judson guest preaching) This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve: but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

May 12 – Seventh Sunday of Easter

The gospel for Easter's seventh Sunday is always taken from the long prayer Jesus prays for his followers in John's gospel on the night before his death, and always includes Jesus' desire that his followers will be one as he and the Father are one. This oneness is not mere doctrinal agreement or institutional unity, but mutual abiding, interpenetrating life, mutual love, and joy. This oneness is the work of the Spirit whom we have received but also await. Come, Holy Spirit!

May 19 – Day of Pentecost

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ's love with the world.

May 26 – Holy Trinity Sunday

When we say God is the triune God, we are saying something about who God is beyond, before, and after the universe: that there is community within God. Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to his Abba (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the one who sent him.

Council Meeting Minutes - Approved April 9, 2024 Respectfully submitted by Cindy Thompson, Secretary

CALL TO ORDER: Mark Holste called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

ATTENDING: Pr. Katie Chullino, Mark Holste, Brian Carlson, Greg Schumann, Cindy Thompson, Cathy Goodman, Sabrina Lee, Paul Puebla, Mike Smith, and Glenn Summers. Absent: Jaime Updegraff.

DEVOTIONS AND PRAYER: led by Pr. Katie.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: approved via email and posted.

FINANCIAL REPORT: General Fund giving this month was above budget by \$1,954 in the month of March. General Fund expenses were over budget by \$5,234. The General Fund is essentially what runs the church. This month's giving was approximately \$756 below last March's giving. See Greg's report for details.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS: See each ministry's monthly report for details.

- Pastor/Staff: Easter services were well attended with approximately 105 and 155 attending.
- Worship: Sabrina shared that selling of the Spring bulbs went well and recommends the same process for next year. See Sabrina's report for attendance numbers.
- **Evangelism**: Paul shared that Cindy Tayler is planning an Earth Day planting activity.
- Faith Formation: Faith Formation is in need of a leader for the Imagination Station (science/craft station) for VBS. Please see Gary if you are interested or have questions. VBS is scheduled for June 24th-28th.
- Mission: Cathy shared the Saint Patrick's Day fundraiser for the Tipi Builder's mission trip brought in \$1810 gross and was attended by approximately 110 people from LOC and BLC. A coordinator for services at the Atria is still needed. Please see Cathy if you are interested in helping with this mission.
- **Property:** Glenn shared a new lawn tractor has been purchased. Glenn talked to Gary about having the Boy Scouts repaint the lines in the parking lot.
- Stewardship: Mike shared Stewardship Ministry would like to continue passing the plate through April which would be a time period that would allow us to compare it to the 2023 Easter period since Easter was in April last year and March this year. At that point we can evaluate the effectiveness of this procedure.



We would like to know how members are living out their faith through volunteerism and if you are willing, we would like to highlight the person and the organization or community that benefits.

Have you ever heard someone point to a person with a dog standing on a street corner holding a sign, and say, "That person shouldn't have a pet. They can't even take care of themselves!" While that may be true for some, it is often the pet that is taking care of the person. Frequently those who are experiencing housing insecurity are estranged from family members and friends. Their only close companion might be their animal friend, and that animal might be the only reason they get up in the morning. Many would rather feed their pet than feed themselves and agonize when they are unable to provide medical care or needed vaccinations for their animal. For the past couple of years I have worked as a volunteer with Annie and Millie's place. In addition to helping at distribution events, I have assisted at pet clinics in both Boulder and Longmont.

Annie and Millie's place can make a real difference in the life of a pet and the person responsible for their care. Frequently, people who are on the street are unable to take advantage of housing opportunities or shelters unless they relinquish their pet. For many, it would be akin to severing ties with their last remaining family member.

Annie and Millie's Place serves pets experiencing homelessness AND their owners and was founded by Kristen Baltrum, former Faith

(continued from previous page) At periodic distribution events, the organization provides food, beds, treats, leashes, collars, crates, and other necessities for pet owners so that they are able to continue to enjoy the companionship of their dog or cat. I have seen firsthand how grateful pet owners are, not only for the gift of food and health care for their pets, but also for the compassion and understanding offered.

In partnership with the Denver Street Dog Coalition, vaccination and health care services are provided for qualifying pets. Licensed veterinarians and technicians work together with volunteers to ensure that as many needy pets as possible are spayed and neutered, chipped, vaccinated and cared for in the best and most humane way possible. In addition, Annie and Millie's place, along with local shelters, offers fostering services for owners experiencing homelessness who may have a sudden urgent need to be separated from their animal, such as hospitalization.

Both the pets and their owners benefit from these services. It makes us pretty happy too!! If you have an interest in serving this particular community, the following link will provide additional information, or you can speak to me in person.
