Rev's Revelations

There's an often overlooked scene in the 6th chapter of Mark, between the beheading of John the Baptist and the feeding of the 5,000, where Jesus says to his disciples, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." Then, the disciples get on a boat and go to a deserted place. And, other people see them leave, follow them, and bring a bunch of sick people to be healed by them.

The disciples' work is unending. There is always someone to heal, to teach, to feed. When one need is met, another arises. The disciples are called to follow Jesus--who meets those needs. At the end of the scene--even though Jesus invites them to rest--the world does not give them rest.

For all the biblical things that don't relate well in our culture (slavery, patriarchy, disease, sacrifices, etc), the need for rest is one thing that most people can identify with. Our society thrives on keeping us busy--work, caring for family, civic engagement, being neighborly, volunteering. For many of us-myself included--resting does not happen easily. Usually, I rest after I've overworked, weakened my immune system, and caught the latest cold/flu/covid virus. I think that's characteristic of a lot of us--in following the savior, we think we have to sacrifice like the savior.

But that's not what Jesus asks us to do. Jesus asks his disciples and apostles to rest! In fact, God has never asked ANYONE to work without rest--from creation, God designated a day of sabbath, a day of rest. God commanded the Israelites to sabbath and to give their servants and animals sabbath, too.

This summer, I am taking a sabbath. I am fortunate to have received a Pandemic Relief Grant for a 6-week mini-sabbatical (a normal sabbatical is 3 months) through the Rocky Mountain Synod 3E Lilly Grant, "to provide support and relief to rostered leaders in the Rocky Mountain Synod so that they can continue to grow and thrive in ministry."The grant gives our congregation resources for a supply pastor and gives me resources to genuinely rest. When I applied for the grant, our BLC Council was gracious and supportive, ensuring that I would get to rest in a deserted place--well, not deserted so much as not right next door to the church and neighborhood shenanigans. I will spend this time relaxing and reconnecting with my personal spiritual practices. And, I am so thankful.

This is something those early disciples didn't get to do and something so many of us never get to do. I am thankful. I am also hopeful. I hope that our church's commitment to taking sabbath spreads further than the pastor. I hope that this sabbatical gives us each pause and empowers us to rest before it's needed. I hope that it helps us to enact policies in the workplace that give people vacation and sick leave and rest.

I hope that it normalizes not overworking and instead prompts you to cancel a meeting (with notice of course), take a vacation (even a staycation), or sleep in on a Sunday (gasp!).

Worship

August 4 – 11th Sunday after Pentecost

Apparently not satisfied by Jesus' feeding of thousands, some who were there press him for a sign of his power; perhaps it is daily manna they want. As always in John's gospel when people want a sign, Jesus offers himself. He is the bread come from heaven to give life to the world. He calls us to come to him and believe in him, and through that relationship to know the one who sent him.

August 11 – 12th Sunday after Pentecost

Jesus says that the bread he gives for the life of the world is his flesh, and whoever eats this bread has eternal life now and will be raised on the last day. In Ephesians Paul tells us what this life Jesus gives us looks like, this life we live as those marked with the seal of the Holy Spirit in baptism. We live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us. The whole purpose of life is giving yourself for the other.

August 18 – 13th Sunday after Pentecost (OUTDOOR)

Wisdom prepares a feast, sets her table, and invites all to come and eat her bread and drink her wine. The first chapter of John's gospel owes much to the biblical tradition that imagined Wisdom as existing before anything was created and having a role in the work of creation. Christ, the wisdom of God (1 Cor. 1:24), today invites us to eat his flesh and drink his blood. John's gospel includes no account of the institution of the Lord's supper, but here we can't help hearing Jesus' words as an invitation to the meal of bread and wine we share.

August 25 – 14th Sunday after Pentecost

In today's gospel many people take offense at Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh and drink his blood; even many of Jesus' disciples peel off. This is the backdrop in John's gospel for Peter's confession of faith. "To whom can we go?" asks Peter, in words we sometimes sing just before the gospel is read. "You have the words of eternal life." In order to take such a stand, as Peter and Joshua did, Paul tells us to arm ourselves with the word of God. We pray in the Spirit that we might be bold ambassadors of the gospel.

September 1 – 15th Sunday after Pentecost

Jesus protests against human customs being given the weight of divine law, while the essence of God's law is ignored. True uncleanness comes not from external things, but from the intentions of the human heart. Last week Jesus told us "the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life" (John 6:63). Now James says God has given us birth by the word of truth. We who were washed in the word when we were born in the font return to it every Sunday to ask God to create in us clean hearts.

September 8 – 16th Sunday after Pentecost

Someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus, as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who prophesied without official authorization. Like Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat. Jesus welcomes good being done in his name, even when it is not under his control. The circle we form around Jesus' word must be able to value good being done in ways we wouldn't do it, by people we can't keep tabs on.

CALL TO ORDER: Mark Holste called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

DEVOTIONS AND PRAYER: led by Pr. Katie. "On Earth As It Is in Heaven" from *May It Be So: Forty Days with the Lord's Prayer* by Justin McRoberts & Scott Erickson.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: approved via email and posted.

FINANCIAL REPORT: General Fund giving this month was below budget by \$1,330.17. General Fund expenses were under budget by \$1,527.17. This month's giving was approximately \$6,375 above last June's giving.

We have 10 youths and 3 adult chaperones leaving Sunday, 7/14 for the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans. Rally Day is scheduled for September 8th.
