September 1 – 15th Sunday after Pentecost

Jesus protests against human customs being given the weight of divine law, while the essence of God's law is ignored. True uncleanness comes not from external things, but from the intentions of the human heart. Last week Jesus told us "the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life" (John 6:63). Now James says God has given us birth by the word of truth. We who were washed in the word when we were born in the font return to it every Sunday to ask God to create in us clean hearts.

September 8 – 16th Sunday after Pentecost
James tells us to stop showing favoritism in the
assembly, treating the rich visitor with more
honor than the poor one. Jesus himself seems
to show partiality in his first response to the
Syrophoenician woman in today's gospel. Was
he testing her faith in saying Gentiles don't
deserve the goods meant for God's children?
Or was he speaking out of his human
worldview, but transcended those limits when
she took him by surprise with her reply? Either
way, the story tells us that God shows no
partiality. Everyone who brings a need to Jesus
is received with equal honor as a child and heir.

September 15 – 17th Sunday after Pentecost

Three weeks ago we heard Peter's confession of faith as told in John's gospel. This week we hear Mark's version, when Peter says, "You are the Messiah." In John, the stumbling block is Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh, given for the life of the world. In Mark too the scandal has to do with Jesus' words about his own coming death, and here Peter himself stumbles over Jesus' words. But Jesus is anointed (the meaning of messiah) in Mark only on the way to the cross (14:3); so we are anointed in baptism with the sign of the cross.

September 22 – 18th Sunday after Pentecost

The disciples quarrel over which one of them is the greatest. Jesus tells them the way to be great is to serve. Then, to make it concrete, he puts in front of them a flesh-and-blood child. We are called to welcome the children God puts in front of us, to make room for them in daily interaction, and to give them a place of honor in the assembly.

September 29 – 19th Sunday after Pentecost

Pastor Samm Melton-Hill preaching
Someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is
casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the
disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus,
as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who
prophesied without official authorization. Like
Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat.
Jesus welcomes good being done in his name,
even when it is not under his control. The circle we
form around Jesus' word must be able to value
good being done in ways we wouldn't do it, by
people we can't keep tabs on.

October 6 – 20th Sunday after Pentecost

Today's gospel combines a saying that makes many of us uncomfortable with a story we find comforting. Jesus' saying on divorce is another of his rejections of human legislation in favor of the original intent of God's law. Jesus' rebuke of the disciples who are fending off the children should challenge us as well. What does it mean to receive the kingdom of God as a child does?

Council Meeting Minutes - Approved August 13, 2024 Respectfully submitted by Cindy Thompson, Secretary

CALL TO ORDER: Mark Holste called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

ATTENDING: Mark Holste, Brian Carlson, Greg Schumann, Cindy Thompson, Cathy Goodman, Sabrina Lee, Paul Puebla, Mike Smith, and Jaime Updegraff. Absent: Glenn Summers and Pr. Katie Chullino.

DEVOTIONS AND PRAYER: led by Cindy. "Give Us Today Our Daily Bread" from *May It Be So: Forty Days with the Lord's Prayer* by Justin McRoberts & Scott Erickson.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: approved via email and posted.

FINANCIAL REPORT: General Fund giving this month was below budget by \$2,829.90 in the month of July. General Fund expenses were over budget by \$1,453.85. The General Fund is essentially what runs the church. This month's giving was approximately \$289 below last July's giving.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS: See each ministry's monthly report for details.

- Worship: Scheduling continues to be difficult. Sabrina's concern is signing up for future months as some of the consistent ushers and assistant ministeries are not available. Please signup if you are able to usher or assist with worship.
- Missions: Due to health issues and few participants, the Hopi Reservation mission trip is postponed until next spring. To date, the Nicaragua fund raiser has raised \$14,575 with the match. In addition, BLC donated 500 dollars from the budgeted amount for Nicaragua and 1000 dollars from Thrivent Choice funds, for a total of \$16,075. Six months of providing care at the children's center costs \$19,000, so we are approximately \$3000 short at this time.
- Evangelism: Movie night was a success. Rally Day is September 8th. Gods Work Our Hands is also happening on September 8th.
- Faith Formation: National Youth Gathering was great. Ten youths from three different congregations (Bethlehem, First Lutheran and Christ Lutheran in Highlands Ranch) and 3 adult chaperones attended the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans from July 14th to 22nd. Attention now is on fall programming including a back-to-school swim party on August 25th, Rally Day on September 8th, and Miller Farms on Saturday, September 21st. Registration for new confirmands will begin in August.

Council Notes (con't)

Property:

- The fire suppression system was inspected and there are two items from the inspection that need attention. 1) Hydro test the city water connect to the system 2) Test four heads in the Worship Center. This will be scheduled for August.
- Sprinkler system is repaired. Repaired the drywall above the AV center.
- Fundraiser update for CIF (Continuous Improvement Fund) is \$2,500. Goal is \$8,000.
- Stewardship: Mike would like, beginning in September, for each ministry head to make a brief temple talk regarding what each ministry does and how other members can participate.

- God's Work Our Hands Sunday Sept. 8: Mark Holste moved and Brian Carlson seconded to allow donations on this day to go toward the following outlined entities. Motion passed.

 - 3. New Beginnings at women's prison: New sports bras and underwear, large sizes of deodorant, shampoo, lotions, soap, conditioners, women's safety razors,
 - 4. Casa de Paz: snacks eaten by hand for back packs (no bars)
 - 5. Annie and Millie's Place: 4lb bags of dog food and cat food
 - 6. Monetary donations for Casa de Paz, ReEntry Initiative, New Beginnings, and Annie and Millie's Place
- Djembe Orchestra Concert Sunday 22 Sep: Mike Smith moved and Sabrina Lee seconded that all donations received will go to Growing Gardens Pratt Street Farm. Motion passed.

Council Notes (con't)

- Mission trip cancelled Donate \$500 for lumber to TIPI Raisers:
 Mark Holste moved and Brian Carlson seconded to donate \$500 for lumber to Tipi Raisers. Discussion: This money has already been raised for the mission trip and the builders need this money to purchase lumber so they can continue the build this fall even though BLC isn't able to attend. Council emphasized the money has to go to the purchase of lumber. Motion passed.
- Girl Scout Troop 76091 bake sale Sunday November 17: Greg Schumann moved to allow Girl Scout Troop 76091 to conduct a bake sale Sunday, November 17 as long as another calendar conflict does not occur (per Tiffany's approval). Sabrina Lee seconded. Motion passed.
- Thursday, October 3rd Dick and Diana Grieve's Memorial Family requesting permission for Champagne Toast: Sabrina Lee moved a single toast of champagne be allowed at the Grieve's Memorial as long as all glassware is disposed of. Paul Puebla seconded. Motion passed.
- Permission to use Josephine September 6-8: Brian Carlson moved that Mark Abromski be allowed to take Josephine to a wedding at Sky Ranch September 6-8 should Tiffany approve with no calendar conflicts. Sabrina Lee seconded. Motion passed.

DISCUSSION:

- Nursery: Sue Smith shared her concern that we don't have a nursery. She recommends Bethlehem begin offering a nursery for at least one service each Sunday. Children from birth to 2 years 364 days would be allowed to be in the nursery. One person would be the nursery attendant for continuity. Another person would volunteer so two would be present. Parents would be asked to volunteer at least one Sunday. Council appreciated Sue's time in coming to Council and the consensus was to move forward with looking at the logistics in providing nursery care.
- Ministry descriptions changes and bylaws changes: Greg sent the Council two documents of ministry description changes and bylaw changes. Council receives the documents for 30 days and then the congregation gets 30 days so we could vote on this at the annual meeting and not have to call a special congregational meeting. A vote will be taken at the September Council meeting. If anyone has changes they must be given to Greg ASAP.
- Stewardship Mike shared the examples of time/talent cards and a stewardship donation card for the 2025 Stewardship drive. Mike also shared an example (from another congregation) of information that can be shared with the congregation on a monthly basis in the newsletter.

Council Notes (con't)

- Budget process for 2025: Greg shared that he needs ministries to begin looking at 2025 needs. Budget forums will be held August 25, September 22, and November 10 between services.
- One Service Congregation Feedback / Council Thoughts: One service for the summer has been a success. Several members have shared they like the one service. BLC will look at continuing this next summer. We will return to two services beginning September 15th at 8am and 10:15am. However, we will have one service on Rally Day (Sep 8), Reformation Sunday (October 27), Thanksgiving Weekend (Dec 1), Sunday after Christmas (Dec 29) and Sunday after New Years (Jan 5).
- Bishop-elect Meghan Johnston Aelabouni installation: All members are invited to installation on Saturday, October 5th at 4pm at Augustana, Denver, CO.
