Rev's Revelations

"I am still discovering to this day, that one only learns to have faith by living in the full this-worldliness of life... living fully in the midsts of life's tasks, questions, successes and failures, experiences and perplexities..." (Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Letters and Papers from Prison)

Our Wednesday Table Talk group is currently discussing the life and works of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German pastor and activist best known for his work against Nazism which led to his execution. (If you want to learn more, join us on Wednesday at noon in the Fireside Room.) Bonhoeffer has been followed by Protestant Christians since the second world war—and is *the* leading figure in seminary ethics courses because of his profound commitment to caring for his neighbor and the world, even in the darkest of times.

By the time many of you read this you will have already voted in the 2024 elections—and perhaps voting will be over. As citizens we may already have chosen a new president, various leaders, and new laws. You may be elated that "your" candidate was chosen or "your" amendment passed. You may be disheartened that they didn't. However your feelings find you, today, you are called. You have a mission. And it's not to be a sore loser or a sore winner. It is to be part of a greater good—bigger than our city, county, state, and nation. You are called as a member of the church, a child of God. You are called out of God's love to live in the full worldliness of life.

Here, at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, we are committed to doing this together, too. Our mission states: **Through God's abundant love we invite, welcome, and serve as a light in the world.**

This means: We invite those who celebrate wins. We welcome those who grieve losses. And, together, we serve for the sake of the world.

That's important, especially now. We could choose to further the divides which have characterized our nation in recent years. Or we can choose to gather, to join our voices in song and hearts in prayer, to join our hands in God's work. We can choose to live in the full worldliness of life, to bear life's tasks, questions, successes and failures, experiences and perplexities together. We can choose faith.

November 3 – All Saints Sunday – Jazz Sunday!

Jesus states the core of God's law: love God with all you are and have, and love your neighbor as yourself. The scribe agrees that Jesus has rightly identified the most important commandments, much more important than sacrifices. It's easy for us to say with the writer of the letter to the Hebrews that sacrifices aren't needed anymore, but harder to acknowledge that all our worship, all our community service, all our social action, all our family caregiving is worthless if it is done without love. **Readings:** Psalm 119:1–8, Mark 12:28–34

November 10 – 25th Sunday after Pentecost

Widows are visible everywhere in today's readings. Jesus denounces those scribes who pray impressive prayers but devour widows' houses. He commends the poor widow who in his view gave far more than the major donors. Jesus doesn't see her simply as an object of compassion or charity. She, like the widow of Zarephath who shares her last bit of food with Elijah, does something of great importance. **Readings:** 1 Kings 17:8–16, Mark 12:38–44

November 17 – 26th Sunday after Pentecost

November begins with All Saints Day and ends in or near Advent, when we anticipate Christ's coming again. It is fitting, then, that the readings today tell of the final resurrection and the end time. In the turmoil of hope, fear, and disbelief that these predictions provoke in us, Hebrews sounds a note of confident trust. Christ makes a way for us where there is no way, and we walk it confidently, our hearts and bodies washed in baptismal water, trusting the one who has promised forgiveness. The more we see the last day approaching, the more important it is to meet together to provoke one another to love. **Readings:** Daniel 12:1–3, Psalm 16, Mark 13:1–8

November 24 – Reign of Christ

Even after Israel had experienced the vagaries of kings, the people still longed for a true king to set things right. He would have the king's title of Anointed One (Messiah); he would be the "one like a human being" (Son of Man) given dominion in Daniel's vision. Jesus is given these titles, even though he is nothing like an earthly king. His authority comes from the truth to which he bears witness, and those who recognize the truth voluntarily listen to him. We look forward to the day he is given dominion, knowing his victory will be the nonviolent victory of love. **Readings:** Daniel 7:9–10, Revelation 1:4b–8, John 18:33–37

To him belong the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen.

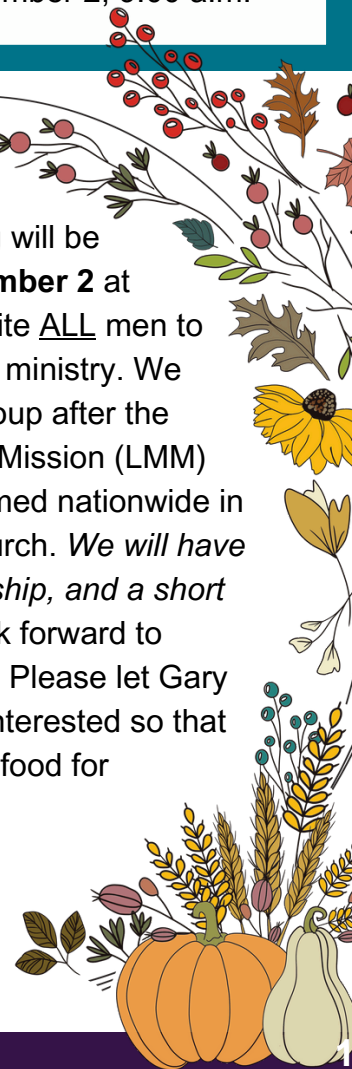

Council Meeting Minutes - Approved

October 8, 2024

CALL TO ORDER: Mark Holste called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

ATTENDING: Mark Holste, Brian Carlson, Greg Schumann, Cindy Thompson, Cathy Goodman, Paul Puebla, Mike Smith, Glenn Summers
Absent: Pr. Katie Chullino, Jaime Updegraff and Sabrina Lee.

DEVOTIONS AND PRAYER: "Lead Us Not Into Temptation, But Deliver Us From The Evil One" from *May It Be So: Forty Days with the Lord's Prayer* by Justin McRoberts & Scott Erickson.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: approved via email and posted.

Djembe Orchestra Concert: Rescheduled to Sunday 20 October – approved via email.

FINANCIAL REPORT: General Fund giving was above budget by \$4,188.78 in the month of September. General Fund expenses were below budget by \$2,393.76. The General Fund is what runs the church. This month's giving was approximately \$7,397 above last September's giving.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS: See each ministry's monthly report for details

- **Pastor/Staff:** See Pastor's report.
- **Worship:** See Worship Ministry report.
- **Missions:** The Social Justice Initiative along with the Immigrant Focus Group did an internal food drive for a Venezuelan family supported by Atonement in Boulder and St Paul in Denver. It was in response to a call from Pastor Stephani of Atonement saying the family was running out of food.
- **Faith Formation:** See Faith Formation ministry report.
- **Property:** Glenn shared the fire suppression system was inspected and there were two items from the inspection that needed attention. 1) Hydro test the city water connected to the system 2) Test four heads in the Worship Center. These items are complete. November 9th is "Clean-Up Day". Scouts will help. The shelves in the north hallway will be removed and disposed of (the shelves are child height and are a safety hazard). Glenn will touch-up with paint.
- **Stewardship:** Continue to speak to members within your circle of BLC friends about the importance of supporting the general fund needs.

Motion passed.
