

Epiphany - Sunday, January 5, 2025, 9:15 a.m.

Too often, we've been told that a successful life is a linear one. But in reality, our lives unfold with many unexpected twists and turns. The Magi follow a star, embarking on a long journey in a foreign land in order to honor the newborn Christ. Instead of returning to Herod as commanded, they trust their dreams and go home by another way. Their road isn't straight, but God "makes a way in the wilderness" (Isaiah 43:19) as they follow their intuition and diverge from the expected path.

Readings: Isaiah 43:16-21, Matthew 2:1-12

Baptism of the Lord Sunday, January 12

Today's festival rejoices in God's blessings. We recall and celebrate our adoption as God's children, the gift of the Holy Spirit, and the promised company of almighty God when we "pass through the waters . . . the rivers . . . fire." On this day the heavens open again for this assembly, and we receive the gift of God's Beloved, Jesus, in bread and wine.

Second Sunday after Epiphany Sunday, January 19

The Sundays after Epiphany continue to celebrate the revelation of God's glory to us as it was made known to the magi and to those on Jordan's banks at Jesus' baptism—today using wedding imagery. Our God rejoices over God's people as those being married rejoice over one another. By the power of the Spirit there are gifts galore for everyone. In Christ Jesus the best wine is saved for last. Taste and see.

Third Sunday after Epiphany Sunday, January 26

God's glory is revealed in the reading of scripture. People stand at attention. People weep. People prostrate themselves in prayer. The unity of the church is another reflection of God's glory. Most gloriously, the promises of God are fulfilled in the person of Jesus Christ. Gather round. Listen up. Glimpse the glory of God.

The Nicaragua Project wishes to express its profound gratitude on behalf of the children in our Children's Project and others in the surrounding barrio. More than 20 people baked for the sale and numerous congregants donated generously at the "Bake a Treat, Put Shoes on a Kid's Feet" bake sale. A total of \$1,248 was raised. Not only will that provide shoes for approximately 83 children, when the shoes are outgrown, they will be passed on to others.
