

Rev's Revelations

40 days.

The world rained and flooded for 40 days while Noah captained the ark. 40 days and nights passed while Moses received the commandments on Mount Sinai. Jesus spent 40 days with Satan, the adversary, in the wilderness. 40 days is how we number long and holy times--like Candlemas. Yes, you read that right. Not Lent (not yet anyway). Candlemas is a holy day, celebrated 40 days after Christmas, sometimes known as the Presentation of Our Lord. The festival commemorates a pretty regular event in the first century: a first-time mother (Mary) traveling to the temple for purification after childbirth with her husband (Joseph) and to present their first-born (Jesus) to God. What makes *this* presentation memorable is how the people in the temple react:

Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

"Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

Another person, the prophet Anna, praised God and told other people about the child!

Consider that at the presentation of Jesus in the temple Mary's song (with the promise to lift up the lowly) and the angel's tidings (of good news of great joy) become real! Jesus is no longer known only to his family and the few lucky shepherds who were working the night he was born. Here, people are beginning to see who Jesus is *and* tell each other, too!

This year, I wonder why we don't make a bigger deal about this story. We breeze past the story and, at best, we maybe sing an extra song about light. But there are other traditions for Candlemas, too. Some have feasts (with pancakes or crepes), some keep out Christmas decorations until February 2, and some bring the candles they use at home to the altar to be blessed for the coming year. I would guess that this holiday gets lost between other big events; after Christmas and Epiphany we run into playoff games, inaugurations, and sometimes even the Super Bowl. This year, I challenge you to let Candlemas shine.

Soon, we'll enter the 40 days of Lent. We'll watch people deny themselves and suffer (in the name of Christ, of course). We'll be reminded of mortality (and eventually resurrection, too). But, right now, we're still in the time after Epiphany. We're still living in the light.

So, look for it! Imagine that you're Simeon or Anna. Don't just imagine that the lowly will be lifted and that good news is promised. Look for goodness around you. Look for salvation, look for good news. Praise God, yes, but more importantly, tell people when you see it. That's the blessing of Candlemas. That's how Christ is present today.

February 2: Presentation of Our Lord

The Presentation of Our Lord is referred to in some corners of the church as Candlemas because of an ancient tradition of blessing all the candles to be used in the church in the coming year at the mass celebrated on that day. It was a way of underscoring the truth of Simeon's confession that this baby Jesus was "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" and a light for glory to Israel. Let the light of every candle in church be a little epiphany of the love of God for all people in the person of God's son, Jesus, the light of the world.

February 9: Fifth Sunday after Epiphany - Scout Sunday

The fifth Sunday after Epiphany continues to highlight unlikely instruments and circumstances appointed to reveal God's glory. "Who will go for us?" God asks. A person of unclean lips, a former persecutor of the church of God, and three fishermen who couldn't catch a thing. More surprising still, perhaps, is that we are also called.

February 16: Sixth Sunday after Epiphany

Blessings and curses abound on the sixth Sunday after Epiphany. We would do well to listen closely to whom the "blessed ares" and the "woe tos" are directed and to find our place in the crowd among those who desire to touch Jesus. The risen Christ stands among us in the mystery of the holy supper with an invitation to live in him, and offers power to heal us all.

February 23: Seventh Sunday after Epiphany

Mercy. Mercy. Joseph lives it in Egypt. Jesus preaches it in the gospel. The Spirit guides us into merciful lives with the power of forgiveness to reconcile what is fractured and divided. Such merciful living is the baptismal blessing of having put on Christ. It is the gift of the life-giving Spirit. It is a reflection of God's glory revealed in Christ.

Rekeying

The Safety Team is finalizing plans for rekeying the church building. Expect changes during this calendar year.

Solar Project Update

Ecology Solar and Dutch Creek Electric have received the first installment. The design and permitting process has begun. The installer was at the church and gathered information from the architectural drawings and measured the roof. They were very pleased with our roof pitch and project overall. They will need to store some equipment/parts in the big shed during the project, so Josephine will have to park outside for a while. Once the permitting is complete, the panels and Micro Inverters will be ordered. We don't know how long the permitting process will take. The install for the panels will take approximately three weeks. Our target for completion is May.

CALL TO ORDER: Brian Carlson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Brian thanked Mark for his last 2 years of service.

ATTENDING: Pr. Katie Chullino, Brian Carlson, Mark Holste, Greg Schumann, Sandy Mickelson, Cathy Goodman, Sabrina Lee, Paul Puebla, Cindy Thompson, Jaime Updegraff and Glenn Summers.

DEVOTIONS AND PRAYER:

- Pastor Katie read the book Saint Nicholas the Giftgiver.
- Last year the council used a devotion book every month. This year P.
 Katie proposed that someone talks about a different saint/legend
 each month. Katie will send out the list of saints by month and we
 should each pick one.
- P. Katie said a prayer to start the meeting.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: approved via email and posted.

FINANCIAL REPORT: We are hoping to hit \$35,000 in giving this month, which leaves us about \$25,000 upside down. Greg updated the congregation on our financials at the Annual Meeting 2025 on December 14th.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS: See each ministry's monthly report for details. • Pastor/Staff (P. Katie):

- Working on sermons for the upcoming week and Christmas.
- 2026 will be BLCs 125th Anniversary and we need to think about our legend, history and inspiration.

Some of BLC's history includes:

- = White Chrismons ornaments (from 60's)
- = Red and blue 2001 BLC ornaments.
- = 2020 Star ornaments given out during the pandemic

December 2024 Council Meeting

Worship (Sabrina):

- She recommends recording the second service in the future. Jaime said it would be good to stream the service the choir is participating in. Worship team should think more about this and decide. Will need to put a notice in the bulletin to notify everyone.
- Poinsettias are coming in on Friday 12/20. There are about 7 more to sell.
- Sandy W. will continue working with greeters.

Service – formerly Missions: (Cathy)

- Hope for the Holidays sent 480 cards to immigrants who are detained.
- \$1,248 was raised in the December bake sale to purchase shoes for children in Nicaragua.
- Needs:
 - A leader for the Immigrant Focus Group
 - A Social Justice person to help Cathy
 - Need someone to organize Our Center lunches
- We can't give out as much as we originally planned due to budget constraints. See Cathy's December Council Report for the list of planned contributions that we will not be able to make.
- Cathy proposed that the Quilters move to the Service Team instead of the Care Team. Jaime seconded the motion. All approved.

• Faith Formation (Jaime):

- Faith Formation has grown and has good participation and attendance. We also have a high school group now. Confirmation and Sunday school are on hold until January. Advent night had at least 40 people. Tomorrow night is the last Advent gathering and the youth will go caroling.
- Area of focus after the first of the year is the Lenten mentoring program. Then they will start planning for VBS.

Property (Glenn):

- Solar project contract was signed 12/17/24. Glenn will manage the project. So far, we have raised \$74,880. LOC has donated several thousand dollars of that total. We should be able to go live with solar in about 4.5 months.
- Cornerstone floors have been stripped and waxed.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

- December 2024 giving was up about \$8,000 over budget with December expenses less than \$500 over budget. Overall income vs. expenses for December were \$7,787 in the positive for the month!
- December giving was approx. \$9,000 more than December 2023. This
 is a good sign that we are on the right track despite overall 2024
 financial issues.
- Overall, 2024 came in approx. \$10,000 below budgeted annual giving and approximately \$10,000 over budgeted annual expenses, giving us a total deficit for the year of \$20,000.
- Greg will be meeting with the staff to review the new Financial Procedures 2025 and Fundraiser Request Form.
- Greg distributed the three December Financial Reports to the Council prior to this Council Meeting.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS: See each ministry's monthly report for details.

• Pastor/Staff (P. Katie):

- Pr. Katie distributed the latest Fundraiser List for 2025 for Council to review prior to the Council Meeting.
- We have two members in hospice care right now.
- LOC wants to help buy new oil candles for Advent next year.
- Staff meetings will be changing to the second and fourth weeks of the month.

Worship: (Sabrina)

- Christmas worship services went well and were well attended.
- Worship will order 30 instead of 40 poinsettias next year.
- Spring bulbs will be available for Easter.
- Sandy W. is organizing and calling the greeters.
- We are having an issue getting enough Ushers to cover services.

Service – formerly Missions (Mark for Cathy):

- Sharon Petersen will head the Social Justice Initiative.
- Mentioned that funds to Nicaragua were cut in both 2024 and 2025.
 2024 Spring and Fall fundraisers also fell below what we need.
 Mark mentioned we have reserves if needed but they will not last long-term.
- Missions would like to propose the following be approved (see 2025 events below):
 - That Bob Cotton can have a book sale in mid-February to

- raise funds for the Hopi Reservation service trip in March.
- That Sharon Peterson's team can have a fundraising tea the first Saturday in May to raise funds to help prevent teen suicide.

Faith Formation (Jaime):

- Sunday school, confirmation and high school youth groups are all back from winter break and meeting again.
- o Lutheran Men in Mission Group continues to meet.
- Mentors are needed for Lenten Mentor Program Confirmands by March 12th.
- Next Family Tradition event will be February 2nd. The youth will host a murder mystery event.
- They have a couple fundraising events coming up to fund their Mission trip to Nebraska.

Property (Glenn):

- The hot water heater has been replaced. It cost approx. \$10,000.
 These expenses came from the Capital Improvement Budget.
- Electrical & engineering will be here January 15th for the Solar project. Permitting process starts after that.
- The fire suppression inspection was done on Dec 30th. It went well.

Stewardship (Cindy T.):

- Stewardship will be putting a letter in the end of year financial statements. Cindy has gathered letters sent in the last several years and will pass those onto Pr. Katie. Pastor Katie will be writing this letter this year.
- Mike and Cindy will write letters for the quarterly financial reports.
- Cindy will work on getting something posted on the Stewardship part of the bulletin board.

CARE - formerly Evangelism (Paul):

 Living Nativity had 140 visitors in December vs. 214 the year before. Many said they could not see the people in the Nativity.
 Next year we will have the firepit going to better light the Nativity.
