Rev's Revelations

This year has been...a lot. It's hard to even go into detail as to why because every time I turn on the news, open email, or log into social media something seemingly major has happened. I know you have noticed it, too, because some of you send me the emails or post on social media or come to the office sharing whatever news is new. Many people are worried--about neighbors who might be immigrants, about friends (and yourselves) who are LGBTQ+, about people who are women, about Social Security and Medicare and Medicaid, about Lutheran Social Services. about jobs, about the future, about security, about the price of eggs, and about the "normal" things like illnesses and busted furnaces and car repairs and snow. Many people are angry-because there are human rights at risk that we've already fought to ensure. Many people are looking for something to do to make life better but are overwhelmed by the immense and intense needs. All year, I keep remembering one of our advent themes from December: do the good that is yours to do.

Friends, I wish I could tell you exactly what to do in response to everything happening right now. Maybe advocate, maybe call your representatives, maybe donate to local service agencies, maybe volunteer, maybe boycott, maybe offer your professional service, maybe hand a red card to the person who cleans your house or makes your dinner or lives next door. I do not know what you are most equipped to do. But I do know that there is good for you to do and that God--who loves the world and you in it--that God commands you to love, too.

Love neighbors, love strangers, love friends, love enemies, love God, love yourself, love in word, love in truth. You can find those commandments in the bible on your nightstand, or on your shelf, or in the pew at church. Today, God's love, though it's much bigger than us, also relies on us. God's love of the world happens where we are (whether we like it or not), with the people around us (whether we like them or not), when we choose to love.

When you don't know what to do with today's news, with your feelings, with yourself--and also when you think you do know what to dopause and ask yourself: Is what I'm doing right now loving? Then do the loving thing.

March 2: Transfiguration of Our Lord

We pray that it will be true of all of us who see God's glory in the word and in the supper and who are being "transformed into the same image" by God's Spirit.

March 5: Ash Wednesday

March 9, 2025 - 1st Sunday in Lent

These forty days called Lent are like no other. It is our opportune time to return to the God who rescues, to receive the gifts of God's grace, to believe with the heart and confess with the mouth the wonder of God's love in Jesus, and to resist temptation at every turn. This is no small pilgrimage on which we have just embarked. It is a struggle Jesus knew. It is a struggle Jesus shares. The nearness of the Lord, in bread and wine, water and word, will uphold and sustain us.

March 16, 2025 - 2nd Sunday in Lent

Though we sometimes doubt and often resist God's desire to protect and save us, our God persists. In holy baptism, God's people have been called and gathered into a God-initiated relationship that will endure. Lent provides the church with a time and a tradition in which to seek God's face again. Lent provides another occasion to behold the God of our salvation in the face of the Blessed One who "comes in the name of the Lord."

March 23, 2025 - 3rd Sunday in Lent

The warnings are plentiful and blunt on the third Sunday in Lent. Cut it out or get cut down! The warnings are accompanied by God's invitation to attentiveness: "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The landowner's ultimatum is forestalled by the gardener's readiness to till the ground one more year. That is good news for all of us. Thanks be to God!

March 30, 2025 - 4th Sunday in Lent

The psalm sets the tone this day: "Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sin is put away!" Happy are those who have "become the righteousness of God" in the merits of Christ Jesus. Happy are those for whom the forgiveness of God has "rolled away . . . the disgrace" of former times. Happy is the father at the return of his prodigal son. Happy are we that our sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. Rejoice!

Sanctuary Upgrades

Do you hear what I hear? Do you see what I see? Over the past few years these two concepts have been challenging for many. During funeral services, not everyone can see the video monitor. The children's programs and the children's sermons are precious. Well, if you are in the first few pews you can see and hear but those online or those in the back cannot. Hearing the choir both in the building and online can be tough. I can go on...

People and dollars have spoken loud and clear. We need to do some upgrades. Through Memorial Funds designations we have approximately \$5,000 for video monitor(s) and related equipment to be permanently mounted on the front wall of the sanctuary. The initial use will be funerals and special events. Down the road the monitor(s) could be utilized for enhancing the worship experience as well.

The electronic equipment in the AV area is getting tired. The Worship Ministry, in conjunction with the AV team, have identified approximately \$5,000 - \$6,000 in upgrades to equipment and sanctuary adornments. Plans are currently being finalized to use funds from the Worship Heritage Fund to complete the upgrades needed. These dollars were set up several years ago, specifically to pay for non-General Fund (non-reoccurring) expenses related to Worship. Items being worked on include upgraded Assisted Listening equipment, new amplification systems, upgraded sound board, new dried flower arrangements, new brass vases, relocation of antenna systems, upgraded wiring and more.

News does travel fast, as many have already approached folks from the AV team asking about the "new sound board". Opportunity knocked and an approximately \$10,000 like-new system was found and the asking price was quite a bit less. Seizing the moment, an offer of \$3,000 was made and accepted. It was paid for with private funds with the intention of using the above mentioned dollars to make it become a church owned system.

Loving Our Neighbors with "Know Your Right's " Cards

Many of our neighbors are at risk of being stopped by ICE or have ICE at their doors. Who are these neighbors? Ones who are not white, have an accent, or do not speak English well. Even people born in the US whose parents were also born here and those here legally with green cards are stopped and can be put into detention and some have been deported. It's important for everyone to know their rights with ICE.

If you know someone who may be at risk, you may give them one of the red cards (located on the narthex bulletin board). The cards explain the rights in English on one side and in Spanish on the other side. If necessary, the cards can be cut apart by them with one side informing them of their rights and the other side to slip under a door or show through a closed window if ICE shows up at their home. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: approved via email and posted.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

- General Fund giving was below budget by \$15,772.27 in the month of January.
 General Fund expenses were above budget by \$128.87. The General Fund is what runs the church. This month's giving was approximately \$13,506.15 below last January's giving.
- In the first 10 days of February, we have received almost the amount of giving that we were down in January. Hopefully February will make up some of January's deficit.
- January's attendance was low due to the cold weather and other factors. This may
 have caused part of the General Giving deficits. We will wait to see how February
 comes in and if it is low again, we will need to communicate the issue to the
 congregation.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS: See each ministry's monthly report for details.

Pastor/Staff (P. Katie):

- A few people have approached Pastor Katie about joining BLC. Part of the reason one person will be joining is because we have a nursery. Thanks Sue!!
- There will be a baptism on Easter.
- Newsletter Recommendation from Staff: Transition to quarterly newsletter to go out May (Summer), August (Fall/New Program Year), November (Winter/Holiday), Feb/March (Spring/Easter). We could transition this spring.

Worship: (Sabrina)

- Attendance was down in January.
- Worship has purchased new artificial flower arrangements and found the missing artificial arrangements.
 - Will not put a flower sign-up chart up because the cost has gone up considerably to \$85 for 2 arrangements.
- We are having issues getting volunteers for second service. We may need to work around having no ushers by doing communion in stations and letting people pick-up their own bulletins.

Service – formerly Missions (Cathy):

- Two Nicaragua Project Board Members left for Somoto at the very end of the month and will return in early February.
- 7-8 people are signed up for the HOPI Mission Trip.
- The Social Justice Initiative will now be named the Social Justice Team and there will no longer be sub-teams for any social justice issue. The Immigrant Focus Group with now be part of the Social Justice Team.
- Three webinars: (Colorado Council of Churches, AAMPARO, and Justice and Mercy) were watched by various members of the Social Justice Team, including Father Teri. They were centered on the legal rights of churches to protect against ICE coming into the building and ideas on how to accompany our immigrant neighbors.
- Ed S will be working with Pr. Katie as a consultant on re-establishing the Ministerial Alliance so that churches can work together on challenges in the current political climate.
- Social Justice suggestions for acknowledging Immigration issues right now are:
 - Candle lighting area in back of sanctuary light a candle for whatever is on your heart. TBD
 - o Include immigrants in the prayers on Sundays TBD
 - March 2nd Social Justice would like to have an Advocacy Forum between services. This was approved by Council.
- Cathy reviewed immigrant rights red cards outlining those rights will be put up on the Service bulletin board and will be made available for anyone that needs them.
- A "What you can do to help in the current political climate" list of ideas will be available for members to pick up in the narthex or on the Service bulletin board.

Faith Formation (Jaime):

- Jan/Feb Highlights:
 - Family Tradition Sunday February's Murder Mystery event
 - Lutheran Men and Mission met on Saturday, Feb. 1st.
 - Sunday school Will continue weekly through spring break.
 - Confirmation In January, Confirmands had a great time engaging with a guest speaker from the Islamic Temple. This month's focus is Buddhism as this year's curriculum focuses on world religions.

Property (Glenn):

- Solar Update Hopefully we will hear this week or next about when permitting and connect requirements for the city will start.
- Office project is moving forward.
- Will look at painting the Narthex next.
- Getting cost estimates from Pace for replacing some of the failing kitchen equipment (ovens, stove, washer) in future years. They pay 80% of all costs (tear out, disposal, and install). We will not replace the equipment now but will have a cost number we can plan for.
- We are now parking the BLC van (Josephine) on Glenn or Rick Green's property, rather than on church property, for security reasons.

Stewardship (Cindy T.):

- Cindy met with Mike and received historical Stewardship materials.
- Thanks to Mark for putting instructions in the bulletin re; registering your King Soopers account to donate to BLC.
- Pastor Katie and Cindy are meeting on new things Stewardship can do in the future.

CARE - formerly Evangelism (Paul):

- Lent suppers begin in March.
- Photo Church Directory is still active.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

- Immigration Stance Policy -Pastor Katie, Brian
 - Pastor Katie distributed Protocols for Staff and Volunteers Engaged In Mission and Ministry and definition of public and private spaces and reviewed them at a high level with Council.
 - If approved, we would need to review with all people in the building.
 - Pr. Katie proposed putting a Private Property sign up at the main doors of the building.
 - We need to have just a few people that are authorized to let ICE into the building. Likely the Pastor, President and Vice President.
 - Do not open a door or window to talk to ICE, or you are authorizing them to come in.
- Discussion around being prepared as a church
 - We have rights, and will not harbor immigrants, but do not want people coming to the Preschool to be picked up by ICE.
- LOC HOPI Trip participants have asked for Food Barrel donations for their upcoming Mission Trip (Pastor Katie or Brian)
 - BLC Council cannot approve another fundraiser at this time but we have a lot of food we collect for the Our Center that could be shared with the Mission Trip participants. LOC can put their own basket up in their area but BLC will not make announcements and ask for donations.
 - Reminder: that we need a Fundraiser Request Form completed for these type of requests.

DISCUSSION:

- Church Rekey Update Special Guest Matt James
 - Matt is working on rekeying the building and upgrading/repairing locks and adding an electronic keypad to the front door.
 - Matt reviewed the building floor plan and new key plan.
 - Goals of plan:
 - Increase security of office areas.
 - Allow for meeting spaces
 - Minimize the number of keys needed.
 - If someone just needs to get into fellowship hall they will not be able to get into other areas. The Master Key will get into fire alarm, HVAC, furnace room, etc. Some areas will not require a key.
 - New keys will be unable to be duplicated without permissions and using a specified licensed locksmith.
 - Background checks, agreements, and multiple approvals will be required.
 - Once a year we will need to review and revise who has keys/access.
 - The rekey project will cost a little over \$13,000.
 - Additional expenses include; Medico keys are approx. \$30 each, plus background checks.
 - The site walk-through was last week and installation will be approx. 3 weeks after they get all materials. It will likely be March before they do the actual

rekeying. Pastor Katie asked for them to be rekeyed in late March to give congregants more notice of this plan.

- AV Upgrades in the Sanctuary Special Guest Matt James
 - We purchased a new sound board due to issues with wireless microphones, wiring, audio when streaming, etc.
 - We also need a new AMP and computer.
 - All AV upgrades are covered by Memorial funds and some Worship funds.
 - The new TV/Screen/Display in front of the sanctuary is here and needs to be installed. Initially it will be used for funerals, occasional display needs, etc. Down the road, it can be used for many other things – TBD.
- We ran out of time to discuss:
 - Fundraiser for general fund ideas
 - Fundraiser sheets

- A new resolution was proposed by Paul to have the proposed policy (Protocols for Staff and Volunteers Engaged In Mission and Ministry and definitions of Public and Private spaces) be reviewed by a qualified attorney ASAP and then vote on via email to adopt these documents as policy. Sabrina seconded the resolution. Resolution was adopted unanimously.
